A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

January 22 marks the 49th anniversary of the Supreme Court's Roe v. Wade decision. Along with the companion Doe v. Bolton decision, Roe v. Wade legalized abortion in the United States. Since then, over 63,000,000 unborn children have had their lives ended by abortion. What was supposed to be allowed only early in pregnancy can now take place right up to the moment of birth. It doesn't stop there. Some states are pushing for laws that would allow you to end the life of a child even after birth. Some people still think abortion is only allowed for the so-called "hard cases" of rape, incest, or danger to the life of the mother. The truth is, abortion is allowed for any reason. When we look at the violence that plagues our society and we hear the statistics about shootings and killings every weekend, it's hard to believe that disrespect for life at its earliest stages does not also contribute to disrespect and disregard for life later on.

The bishops of the United States have asked that January 22nd be observed as a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life and of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. We will have a Respect Life Holy Hour in church following the morning Mass on Saturday, January 22. Please try to join us if you can.

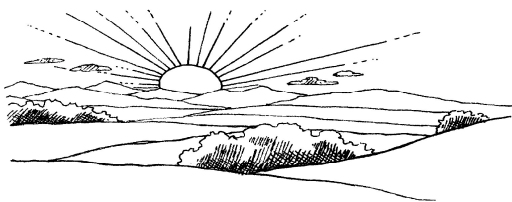
As I write this, the number of COVID-19 deaths in the United States stands at 842,141 since the pandemic started. We kill more unborn children in one year than have died from COVID-19 in over two years. We have been doing this every year since 1973. We have made all kinds of changes to our lives to try to stop the death of anyone from COVID-19. Yet any attempt to change our lives or our laws to try to stop the deaths of so many unborn children is usually met with tremendous opposition. We have turned our lives and our world upside down because 842,141 people have died from COVID-19. We don't blink an eye at the over 63,000,000 babies who have been aborted.

As we mark this sad anniversary next Saturday, I hope we will give some thought to the right to life and the issues that surround it. I hope you will try to join us for the Holy Hour if you are able. I hope we will all pray that human life will one day be legally protected from the moment of conception until the moment when life naturally comes to an end.

The announcement about any structural changes that will take place in our *Renew My Church* grouping with St. Bernadette and Queen of Martyrs is scheduled for Tuesday, January 25, at 6:30 PM. Bishop Andrew Wypych, our regional bishop, will be with us to join us in prayer and share this important update about the future of our parishes. This will take place online. There will be a number of announcements about different parish groupings in addition to ours that will be made on January 25. Please continue to pray for all those making these upcoming *Renew My Church* decisions, and for all the parishes that will be affected by them.

PROBLEM CHILDREN

The Corinthians seem to have been Paul's problem children. His two letters to them are much longer than any of his other letters—two, three, or four times as long as some. It seems that if the early Christians at Corinth could misunderstand or do something wrong, they would. Fortunately for us, the two letters to the Corinthians, though they contain much didactic or instructional material, also provide some of Paul's most well-crafted and grace-filled writing. This is certainly true today, with Paul's litany of gifts that the Spirit bestows on the faithful, even to this day. Paul seeks to calm the squabbling that seems to have been going on, as the Corinthians tried to claim one gift or another as more important. All gifts come from the same Spirit, Paul reminds them; and the various gifts are given for the benefit of the community. When jealousy arises in our midst today, we can still turn to Paul's insights so we might stop being prideful, problem children.

In the Gospel scene at Cana, we see Mary turning to her own child, Jesus. Perhaps she recalled the power of the Spirit that had flowed in her womb at his Incarnation, leading her to discern that surely he must have Spirit-given gifts that could help with the impending crisis at the wedding. As at her Annunciation, she may not have been completely certain, at first, exactly how this would come about, but in faith at Cana she turned to Jesus. In faith, her words, "do whatever he tells you," echoed her reply to Gabriel: "Let it be done to me as you say." In faith, she knows whatever words the Word will speak are bound to bring another inbreaking of the Spirit, another manifestation of God's reign. And she is right. Her wondrous child, John the Evangelist tells us, performed his first wonder there, and signaled the presence of the divine in the everyday.

CAN YOU THINK OUTSIDE THE BOX?

The catch phrase today in business is ‘thinking outside the box.’ It refers to the ability to make decisions based on solutions that are unusual and unexpected. Employees are encouraged to use their creativity in brainstorming sessions where you ‘throw ideas against the wall to see what sticks.’

This plays out in very entertaining ways on a variety of cooking shows, particularly competitions. The biggest mistake a chef can make is to cook an ordinary dish. Just following a recipe and producing something by the book is sure to get one eliminated in the earliest round of the battle.

Another way this plays out is that we have become a society that does not value traditional ways of doing things. Following directions or listening to the wisdom of those who may know more than we do is to be avoided. We look for the entrepreneur, the maverick, the rogue, the non-conformist, the next dot.com person.

This is a 180 degree turnaround from the culture surrounding our gospel of today. At that time, there was an accepted way of doing things and to act outside conventional protocol was a breach of etiquette. It just wasn’t done. And if it was, it was considered a serious loss of honor. In today’s gospel, two events were set into motion that could have been disastrous for the bride and groom. First, they ran out of wine. Second, a wine superior to what was served initially,

appears. Each one by itself spelled real trouble.

Luckily for them, Mary was there. And even luckier, Mary was a woman ahead of her time. She was a woman who was ‘thinking outside the box.’ We’re told she became aware that the wine had run out. She approached Jesus and simply said, “they have no wine.” She didn’t worry about convention, she wasn’t concerned that she was out of line, or whether or not she was overstepping her bounds. She saw a need and just believed her son would help.

Now, we all know how the story turns out. But, for me, today, the real focus is the courage and creativity that Mary exhibited. She, a woman, had dared to put her son, the head of her household, on the spot...and in front of everyone. Yet, her faith was strong. She calmly and confidently knew that Jesus would not let her down.

As parents, we understand the importance of passing on the faith to our children; however, we often struggle with the best way to do that. Maybe we need to emulate Mary and ‘think outside the box.’ There are a multitude of hands that work behind the scenes to make School of Religion successful. Is there a way to add your hands to the mix? If you trust in Jesus, I believe that he will fill you with enough grace to help you find ways to fulfill your role as your child’s first teacher of the faith in extraordinary ways.
