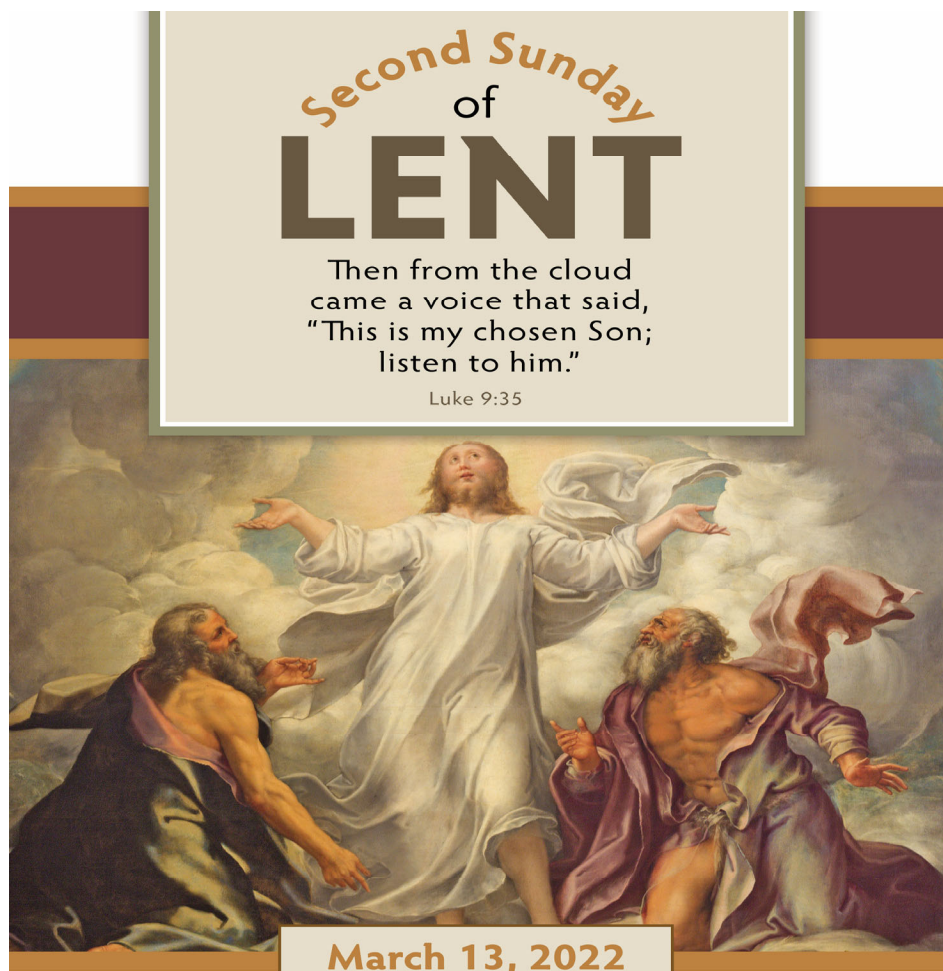

MISSION STATEMENT

We, the family of Most Holy Redeemer Parish, commit ourselves to enriching our relationship with God by following the teachings of Jesus Christ. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

This past October, Pope Francis formally opened a two-year process called “Synod 2021-2023: For a Synodal Church.” This is being called by some the “Synod on Synodality.” This process involves the expansion of an established institution, the Synod of Bishops. Bishops around the world will consult with everyone from parishioners to clergy, religious men and women, and Catholic universities before coming together for a discussion in 2023. The topic of the synod will be how the Church can rely more on this process of consultation and discussion and become more “synodal” in its governance. The Church has held synods before, but this one will have potentially sweeping consequences.

I know many are unfamiliar with a Synod and what it does. The name comes from an ancient Greek term that means “coming together” or “traveling together.” Ancient Christians developed a custom of local leaders coming together to pray and make decisions about matters affecting all the Christian communities in a region. They gathered in the faith that their prayers and discussions would reveal God’s will and the way to achieve it. These gatherings came to be called “synods.” A tradition began of regional synods for bishops as well as larger synods which came to be known as “ecumenical councils.”

As the power of the papacy grew, ecumenical councils continued to be called, but regional synods grew less important. After the Protestant Reformation, regional synods were rarely called. Ecumenical councils also became very rare. Only two were held in a 400-year period. The most recent was the Second Vatican Council which met from 1962-65. Vatican II launched important changes in Church law and structure.

One of Vatican II’s goals was to revitalize the importance of bishops as the heads of their local churches. Vatican II also emphasized the importance of the cooperation of bishops with one another. As a college of bishops, under the leadership of the pope, the bishops are mutually responsible for the governance of the whole Church. To assist in reaching this goal, Pope Paul VI created a permanent structure for a Synod of Bishops, with a Secretariat in Rome and a General Assembly gathered regularly by the pope. Since 1967, there have been 18 meetings of the Synod of Bishops.

Pope Francis has shown a special interest in the Synod of Bishops. Pope Francis has reminded us that synods are based on cooperation. To Pope Francis, a synodal church is a church that listens. In 2018, he issued new regulations that encourage much wider consultation with members and organizations of the Church at all levels as part of the synodal process.

The “Synod on Synodality” is the culmination of this effort to bring a greater degree of openness, collaboration, and mutual listening to the Church. Unlike previous synods, this one officially begins in dioceses all over the world, with opportunities for mutual consultation at every level and among many different church organizations. There is an opportunity for anyone interested to give your input to the Synod. There will be more about how to do this in next week’s bulletin.


The situation in Ukraine is of great concern for all. Please pray for peace in Ukraine and for all those suffering from the warfare taking place. Fr. Benedykt from St. Bernadette has a friend who is the head of Catholic Charities in Poland. He is collecting items to be sent to Poland to aid the refugees coming to Poland from Ukraine. Information about how you can contribute to this can be found in the bulletin this weekend. Please try to help if you can.

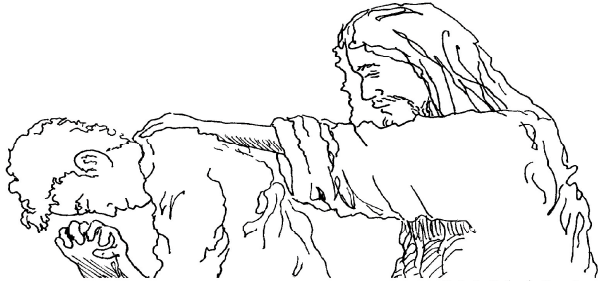

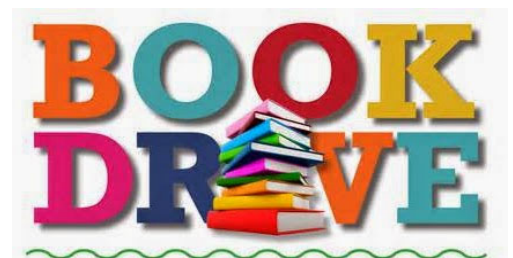
