With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Last week, I wrote in the bulletin about the Synod that will take place in 2023. I hope that helped you to better understand just what a Synod is. The upcoming Synod in 2023 asks for input from Catholics around the world. This week, I want to let you know how you can give your input for the Synod if you would like to do so.

You can give your input online. Go to www.archchicago.org/news-and-events/synod. Scroll down to the section titled, “Sharing Your Thoughts.” You will be asked to share your thoughts on three items: communion, participation, and mission. A synodal Church, in announcing the Gospel, “journeys together.” In offering our input, we are asked to think about how this “journeying together” is happening in our local Church. Please take some time to reflect and pray before you give your input.

Communion is not so much about the Eucharist. We are being asked here to think about the fact that we are side by side on the same road. How are we growing as companions? Listening is the first step, but we must listen with open minds and hearts, without prejudice. We must allow all voices to speak in freedom, truth, and charity. We also must be aware of those who are on the margins in our community. How do we encounter them and listen to their voices?

Participation is our full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations. The Second Vatican Council called this full, conscious, and active participation the “source and summit of Christian life.” What does that mean in a post-pandemic world? Can we maintain participation without people at Sunday Mass?

While Sunday Mass is the most visible aspect of our religion, the Church’s mission also includes service, evangelization, teaching, and healing. Think about whether your faith steers you when you are making decisions or weighing values. Does your faith bring you consolation? Does it challenge you to sacrifice? Synodality entails being receptive to change, formation, and ongoing learning. Keep in mind that above all, the mission of the Church is to work for justice, peace, and respect for all human life.

If you choose to give your input, please think and pray about what communion, participation, and mission mean. If you choose to give your input for the upcoming Synod, you must do so by April 1, 2022.

Thanks to everyone who marched with our parish in the Southside St. Patrick’s Day Parade last Sunday. We had a very nice representation of parishioners, and a nice sunny day to walk down Western Ave. It was nice to have the parade back this year. Thanks to all our parishioners who marched in the parade with Most Holy Redeemer. A Yeti cup was found on the trolley following the parade last Sunday. If you were on the trolley and are missing your Yeti cup, please contact me to pick it up.

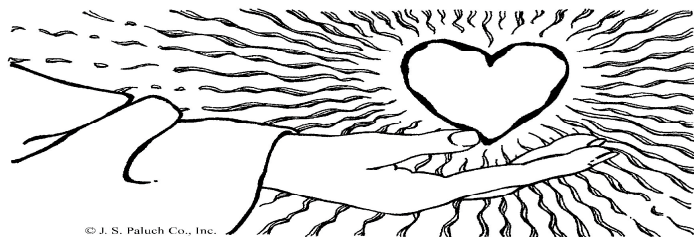

CHICAGO PERIOD PROJECT

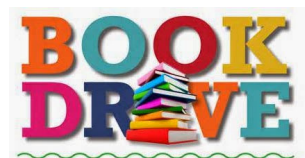
