MISSION STATEMENT

With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

“They’ll never cancel Holy Week or Easter!” Those were my thoughts a year ago at this time. Holy Week and Easter were just too important to not observe in church with our usual liturgical celebrations. Boy, was I ever wrong. It was still Holy Week. It was still Easter. We still celebrated. But it was very different in an empty church. Even though we observed these most important days as best we could, it still felt like they had been cancelled.

This year, things are a little different, and thankfully so. We will be able to have our Holy Week and Easter liturgies. It will be a little different because we will still have limited attendance and have to make reservations. Certain rituals will be missing from our liturgies, such as the Washing of Feet on Holy Thursday. But we don’t have to cancel our Holy Week and Easter liturgies this year, limiting them to on-line viewing. While the government and the Archdiocese will allow us to have these liturgies this year in church with a congregation, they still could be cancelled. We might cancel them ourselves. We might cancel Holy Week in our lives by treating it as no different from any other week. We may cancel the Triduum and Easter liturgies by choosing to stay home or finding other things to do instead.

I hope we won’t effectively cancel Holy Week and Easter this year. I hope we will try to participate in as many of the liturgies this week as we can. Mass on Holy Thursday begins at 7:30 PM. Mass will be followed by adoration in church until 11:00 PM. On Good Friday, Stations of the Cross will take place at 3:00 PM. The Liturgy of the Lord’s Passion will take place at 7:30 PM. On Holy Saturday, Easter baskets will be blessed in church at 11:00 AM. The Easter Vigil will begin at 7:30 PM. On Easter Sunday, Masses will be at 8:00, 9:30, and 11:00 AM. Reservations have to be made for these Masses. You can do so by using the Sign-Up Genius at the parish website (www.mostholyredeemer.org) or by calling the rectory (708-425-5354).

There are several opportunities to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation this week. For those who will be reading the bulletin on-line prior to the weekend, Confessions will be heard on Saturday, March 27, from 2:30 – 4:00 PM. Confessions will also be heard on Tuesday, March 30, from 7:00 – 8:00 PM, and on Saturday, April 3, from 10:00 – 11:00 AM.

Last year, the neighborhood Stations of the Cross on Good Friday were a big hit. We will repeat the neighborhood stations again this year. Please check the parish website and social media for more information about this and for the route that will be followed this year.

This coming week is a sacred time as we celebrate our Lord’s passion, death, and resurrection, the saving events through which we have our salvation. The government and the Archdiocese are not cancelling our observance of Holy Week this year. Let’s make sure we don’t cancel it ourselves. I hope you will join us for as many of the Holy Week liturgies as possible.

With Fr. Paul being away with the military for at least 6 months, that leaves just Fr. Adamich and myself to take care of everything. We resumed the 6:30 AM morning Mass at the beginning of Advent. We have continued the 6:30 AM Mass through Lent. Beginning on Monday, April 5, we will not have a 6:30 AM Mass Monday through Friday. This is temporary until I either find some additional help or we rearrange the schedule a bit. We have been offering two daily Masses for the last four months while most other parishes have only been offering one daily Mass. I ask for your patience and understanding as we try to work things out.

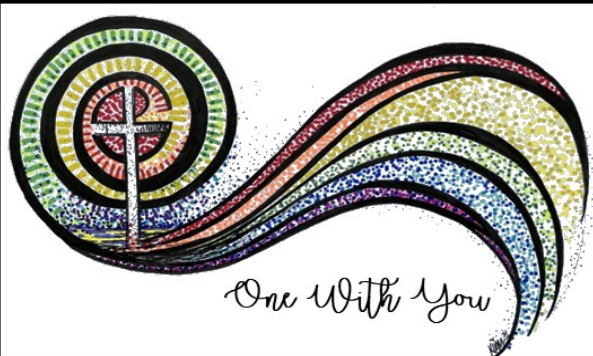

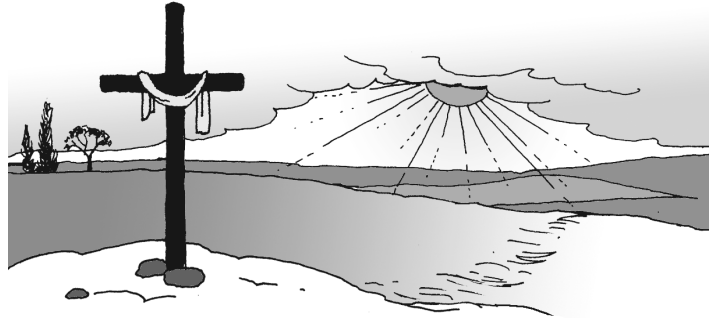
