## **A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

Inserted in this week's bulletin is a copy of a decree signed by Cardinal Cupich. A decree is a pronouncement or document that formalizes a decision within the Church. This decree concerns the *Renew My Church* decision that was made for our Evergreen Grouping of Most Holy Redeemer, St. Bernadette, and Queen of Martyrs. Most of the decree concerns the uniting of St. Bernadette and Queen of Martyrs and the questions arising from that unification. There are though, two matters that concern Most Holy Redeemer that I would like to mention.

The first has to do with a redrawing of parish boundaries. Canon Law, the set of laws that govern the life of the Church, specify that parishes may only unite when they are contiguous, that is, when they share a common boundary. In order for St. Bernadette and Queen of Martyrs to unite, the territory of Most Holy Redeemer bounded by 98<sup>th</sup> St. on the north, Kedzie Ave. on the east, 99<sup>th</sup> St. on the south, and Spaulding Ave. on the west, is being added to the united Queen of Martyrs and St. Bernadette. This will fulfill the requirement that uniting parishes be contiguous while also reassigning the smallest amount of territory possible. This does not affect the parish membership of those residing in this one square block area. They can still maintain their present parish membership, whether it be at Most Holy Redeemer or another parish.

The decree states that Most Holy Redeemer has capital needs of \$2,305,850.00. This is the second item I want to address. As part of the first phase of *Renew My Church*, the Archdiocese sent a team out to inspect the facilities at each of the parishes in our grouping. They went over the place with a fine-toothed comb and recommended that we make capital improvements in the afore-mentioned amount. There are a few things about this we should keep in mind. First, there is nothing in the report that requires immediate attention. We will be putting a new roof on the school this summer. Plans for that were underway before we received this report. The Archdiocese recommends that the work called for in the report be done over the next seven years. This should put your mind a little more at ease if you see that dollar amount listed and think the place is falling apart. It's not.

The amount the Archdiocese estimates for these capital improvements is the estimated price for having a contractor come in and do the work. I haven't gone over the entire report in great detail, but it does look like there are items listed that we could take care of ourselves. Another thing to keep in mind is that a lot of the report deals with the upgrading of what we currently have. For example, the heating and cooling systems for the church and the rectory still work, but they are old. They have to be switched over from heating to cooling in summer and from cooling to heating in the fall. Because the systems are old, we can't just flip a switch. We have to have someone come in and change the system over. That's why we sometimes have to suffer through some hot days and cold days in church. If we switch the system from heating to cooling at the first sign of warm weather, we won't have heat if the temperature drops after that. That's just because the system is old. Even though it still works, the Archdiocese recommends in the report that we upgrade our heating and cooling systems. There are a lot of similar improvements called for to update other aspects of our parish facilities that are still working but are getting old. We will have to look at the report in detail to determine which of these improvements we can make and when we can make them. I just want you to understand these few things and keep them in mind when you see that large dollar amount listed for capital needs.

Next Saturday, April 9, there will be extended hours for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Confessions will be heard from 3:00 – 4:30 PM on Saturday, April 9. Confessions will also be heard on Tuesday, April 12, from 7:00 – 8:00 PM, and on Saturday, April 16, from 10:00 – 11:00 AM.

## SEEING WITH GOD'S EYES.....

Many years ago I was having a conversation about the best age for Confirmation with several colleagues. Without going into details, let me just say that every person had good, valid reasons for their belief in Confirmation at age 13, age 16, or *even earlier* at age 8. Finally, though, someone said, "The only way we will ever come together on this, is if there is a 'paradigm shift' in the way the Church, as a whole, views Religious Formation/Education." I had to think about that because to be honest, at the time, I did not know what he meant by a paradigm shift. When I got back to my office I immediately 'googled' it!

It seems a paradigm shift is one in which society literally shifts its world view. For example, once it was accepted that the earth revolved around the sun, only then were we able to broaden our understanding of who we are and how we, on earth, fit in the universe. As a result, science had new directions to explore and theologians began to see a God of even more possibilities.

Paradigm shifts have also occurred in our relationship with God. Once the Hebrews left Egypt, they could never again view life through the lens of slavery. Although there were many who tried, calling on Moses to take them back to Egypt, there were many more for whom the human dignity that freedom brought would no longer allow an attitude of subservience. Thus, by the time they arrived in the land God led them to, they were a strong and proud people. They also had been given the Mosaic Law by God, a guide to give them a way to **stay** strong and in God's favor. Thus, the strict interpretation of the Law was seen as the only way to accomplish that.

But then, along comes Jesus. He wants God's people to stretch their hearts to see God's Law with God's eyes. He wants them to see that there is a much deeper meaning to the Law than just a literal understanding of the words. He says, it's not enough to not kill, to not commit adultery, or to not swear an oath. What God's law does is to call them into a deeper, more profound relationship with God **and** with one another. One in which there is an understanding that even being angry leads to the death of friendship; that adultery leads to the death of a stable family environment; that swearing an oath leads to the death of one's honesty and integrity. He is asking that they, **and we**, look beyond what the law *says* to what the law *means* so that our relationship with God and each another can be alive in God's love. But that can only be done by changing the 'world view' of what we understand the Law to be.

Thankfully, we have Jesus to guide us. He has asked us to view God's Law through the lens of Love. Just as God's love for us is always filled with compassion for our weaknesses as human beings, with understanding that no one is perfect, and with hope in our ability to move forward having learned from our mistakes, our love for one another should do the same.

As parents, our goal should always be to guide our children to look beyond just what the commandments say to what they mean. Is there always conflict between siblings? It's okay to be angry, but we should teach them how to resolve the root cause of their anger so they can move forward anew as loving brothers and sisters. If we can help them do that, then their response in any given situation will be an authentic response of one who is a true child of God and follower of Jesus. Now **that** is a paradigm shift of heavenly proportions!

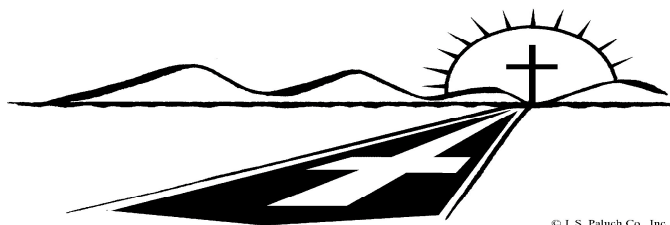


