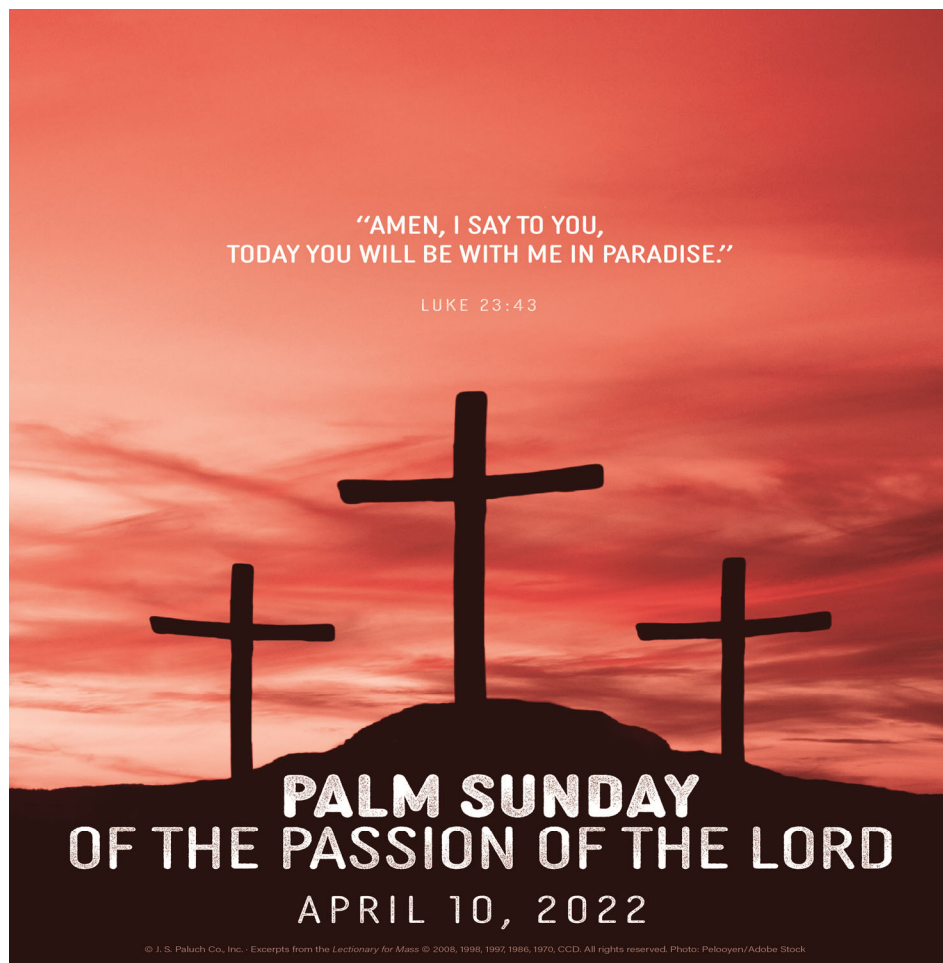

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Holy Week begins this weekend with the celebration of Palm Sunday, or Passion Sunday as it is also known. This coming week brings a culmination to Lent as we celebrate our Lord's passion, death, and resurrection. I hope you will try to join us for our Masses and other services this week.

On Holy Thursday, we celebrate the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7:30 PM. At the Last Supper, Jesus gave us the Eucharist and instituted the priesthood. He also gave us a great example of service as He washed the feet of His Apostles. We will remember these events at our Mass on Holy Thursday. Following Mass, there will be Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament until 11:00 PM. Adoration will close at 11:00 PM with a brief prayer service.

On Good Friday, Stations of the Cross will take place in church at 3:00 PM. The outdoor Stations of the Cross that have been well-received the past two years, will also take place from 12:00 noon until 3:00 PM. This week's bulletin had to be sent in early due to printing deadlines. So unfortunately, the route for the outdoor stations is not yet available. At 7:30 PM, the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion takes place. This service is not a Mass. It includes the reading of the Passion, the Veneration of the Cross, and Holy Communion.

On Holy Saturday, Easter baskets will be blessed in church at 11:00 AM. This is originally an eastern European custom that is catching on more and more. The idea behind it is that the fasting of Lent is broken with specially prepared foods that have been blessed. The baskets and the various food items they contain all remind us of our Lord's passion and resurrection. If you go to www.poloniamusic.com/PolishEasterCustoms.html, you can find information about what foods should go in the basket for blessing.

The Easter Vigil will begin outside in front of church at 7:30 PM with the blessing of the new fire and the lighting of the Paschal Candle. Baptismal water will be blessed and used as we renew our baptismal promises. The Easter Vigil does take longer than a regular Mass, but it is very beautiful and meaningful. Liturgically, it is the high point of the year. If you have never attended the Easter Vigil, or if it's been a while since you have, please consider attending this year. The Easter Vigil helps us to better understand and appreciate what we will see in church throughout the Easter Season. On Easter Sunday, we will have Masses at 8:00, 9:30, and 11:00 AM. The renewal of our baptismal promises, which we have been preparing for during the weeks of Lent, will take place at each Mass.

There will be some opportunities for the Sacrament of Reconciliation during the week. Confessions will be heard in church on Tuesday evening, April 12, from 7:00 – 8:00 PM, and again on Saturday, April 16, from 10:00 – 11:00 AM.

There was a time when our culture helped to keep this week holy. Businesses closed on Good Friday. Sporting events were not held. In these and other ways, our culture reminded us that there was something special about these days, something that took precedence over all else. Unfortunately, that time is in the past. That means it is up to us to keep this week holy and help people remember the salvific events that we recall during Holy Week. I hope you will try to join us for our Holy Week and Easter Masses and services, and try to keep this week the special one it is meant to be.

DO YOU KNOW THE STORY?

We might assume that we know the scriptures and tend to tune out something as difficult to comprehend as the Passion of Christ. What we often end up doing is taking all four of the Gospels and sort of mixing the accounts into one story. The theologian Gerhard Lohfink called this “making Gospel Soup.” Today’s Passion is from the Gospel of Luke, and there are some elements that are very different from Matthew and Mark (the other synoptic Gospels read in Lectionary years A and B), and John’s Gospel text which is always proclaimed on Good Friday. Let’s look at the elements that are specific to Luke as we break the Passion into five sections.

Lord’s Supper (22:14–38) Luke portrays Jesus as fiery and working for justice, both in his passion and in his ministry. The Passover feast is a very special time for the disciples, and while they are being commissioned, it is clear that they do not understand yet how they will carry on; Jesus warns them to protect them from evil.

Mount of Olives (22:39–53) Luke’s Jesus doesn’t seem as desolate as in other accounts about his imminent death, and goes to pray in regular fashion. He calls out his betrayer by name, hinting at foreshadowing of knowledge.

Peter’s Denial – Sanhedrin (22:54–71) One can see the special care Jesus takes for Peter, and the scene takes place in the courtyard where Jesus was earlier abused as a prophet.

Trials before Pilate and Herod (23:1–25) In this account Pilate and Herod both proclaim Jesus to be innocent, and this heals a “rift” between them. Jesus is good even to those who maltreat him.

Crucifixion, Death, and Burial (23:26–56) There are no soldiers; it is the chief priests who take Jesus to Pilate. Jesus’ words on the Cross are kind: “Father forgive them.” In Mark’s Gospel both criminals mocked Jesus, but here one of them begs forgiveness, and Jesus grants him salvation. Jesus’ last words show a sign of trust: “Father, into your hands . . .” May we also place our trust in God as we enter into Holy Week.

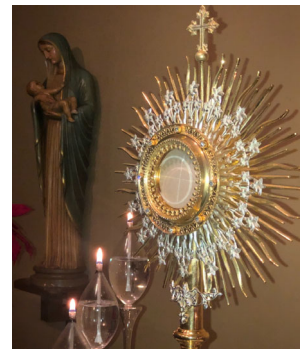


