

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

This is the time of year when priests celebrate the anniversary of their ordinations. Fr. Adamich celebrated the 74th anniversary of his ordination on May 8. I celebrated my 41st anniversary on May 13. Since Fr. Adamich is the oldest and longest serving priest in the Archdiocese, he doesn't have any classmates left at this point. We had a nice steak dinner at the rectory this past Tuesday to celebrate his 74th anniversary, and also his 100th birthday. I went out with my classmates this past Wednesday.

Our class gathering was a lot smaller this year than it has been in other years. There were only five of us there, only three of whom are still active priests. The other two were guys who got ordained with us but then left the priesthood. The fact that there were so few of us there was a reminder that not only have we had three classmates who left the priesthood and three more who have died, but also that we are getting older. Because of health and other factors, we just aren't all able to get together as we once did.

Even though it was a lot smaller this year, our annual gathering followed a familiar pattern. We talked about the past year and what has happened in our lives. Since we're getting older, we talked a lot more about our aches and pains and surgeries. We had a toast to 41 years in the priesthood. As an aside, we also toasted, as we do every year, how many of those years have been happy ones. This year, we toasted 28 happy years out of 41. This is just a reminder to us that we all struggle at times. It's not easy to be a priest in today's world. We all face problems and difficulties that make our lives unhappy at times, but we keep on going. Priesthood is a vocation. It is a commitment. You don't give up on it because you're going through a rough patch.

As I mentioned, two of our classmates who left the priesthood were there on Wednesday night. One of them joins us every year. The other one was someone I hadn't seen in many years. I was happy he was there. It was good to see him. He offered an additional toast. He said that he does not regret the decision he made, and that his life has turned out fine and been very good. But as he looks at us, he said that priesthood matters. What we do is important and makes a difference.


I think it's that hope that keeps us going. It was different when Fr. Adamich was ordained and when I was ordained too. The priesthood had not suffered the blows, many self-inflicted, that it since has. Priests by and large were respected and admired. When we were ordained, Church and religion were much more important than they are today. Even though a lot has changed since ordination, I still believe the priesthood is important. I believe it matters. I know Fr. Adamich believes that. All priests do. What keeps us going is the hope that what we do makes a difference.

28 happy years out of 41, even if said in jest to a certain degree, is a reminder that all priests do a better job of being priests on some days than we do on other days. We're not perfect by any means, but we keep going. I think what keeps us going is the hope that what we do as priests is important enough to somehow make a difference for the better in your lives. I'm sure Fr. Adamich hopes he has done that for the people he has served for the past 74 years. I know I hope I have done that for the people I have served the past 41 years. We hope we'll be able to continue through our priesthood to make a difference for the better in your lives for years to come.


