A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Blaise Pascal was a French mathematician, physicist, inventor, writer, philosopher, and theologian. He was the inventor of an early calculator. He did a great deal to help formulate the laws of probability. He made important contributions to the study of fluids, and clarified the concepts of pressure and vacuums.

As a philosopher and theologian, he came up with what is known as “Pascal’s Wager.” “Pascal’s Wager” states that there are two realities: either God exist or God does not exist. Based on those two realities, you can live your life as if God exists or as if God does not exist. If you live your life as if God exists and it turns out that God does exist, everything is fine. You will have lived a good, admirable life and will enjoy eternal life in heaven. If you live as if God exists and it turns out God does not exist, you may miss out on some temporal pleasures and luxuries, but you don’t lose any more than that. If you live as if God does not exist and it turns out that there is no God, you haven’t lived a good, admirable life, but you don’t lose anything. If however, you live as if there is no God and it turns out that God exists, you lose everything. “Pascal’s Wager” asks if you are willing to take that chance.

I have always enjoyed reflecting on “Pascal’s Wager.” I think it poses a very interesting way of thinking about the life that each of us is leading. But I also like it because it asks you to think about the consequences of the choices you make. Actions have consequences, yet we often seem to act without considering what the consequences will be and how we and other people will be affected by them. I think this is something for us to keep in mind this weekend as we celebrate the 4th of July and the freedom we enjoy as Americans.

Very often, we seem to think that freedom means we can do whatever we want, whenever we want to. We often exercise our freedom with little thought of the consequences. Blaise Pascal would certainly consider that a foolish way to act. We do have to consider the consequences of what we are choosing to do before we make our choice. Catholic teaching too, asks us to consider what the effects of our actions will be. What could happen if I make this choice? How will it affect me? How will it affect others? If there are possible consequences that I don’t want to face, maybe I should think again as “Pascal’s Wager” implies.

Catholic teaching also tells us that we are given our freedom not so we can indulge ourselves and our desires. We are given our freedom so we can freely choose to do what is right and good. We are given our freedom so we can freely choose to love God and others. Using our freedom in this way allows us to give glory to God. Using our freedom in this way allows us to do what will be the best for other people and for ourselves.

As we celebrate the 4th of July and our freedom, let’s give some thought to how to best exercise our freedom. Blaise Pascal would certainly tell us to think before we act, to consider what could happen and if we want it to happen before we make our choice. That is certainly a wise way to exercise our freedom. Let’s also keep in mind that our freedom is given to us so we can freely choose to do what is right and good. Our freedom is given to us so we can freely choose to love God and others. Exercising our freedom in this way is the best way to use this great gift. Exercising our freedom in this way gives the greatest glory to God. Just something to think about as we celebrate our independence and the freedom we enjoy. Happy 4th of July!

Statement of Cardinal Blase J. Cupich, archbishop of Chicago, on the Supreme Court's decision in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* June 24, 2022

Today, the U.S. Supreme Court issued its ruling in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*, which overturns the court's tragic 1973 decision that removed legal protection for unborn children. We welcome this important ruling and the opportunity it creates for a national conversation on protecting human life in the womb and promoting human dignity at all stages of life. This moment should serve as a turning point in our dialogue about the place an unborn child holds in our nation, about our responsibility to listen to women and support them through pregnancies and after the birth of their children, and about the need to refocus our national priorities to support families, particularly those in need.

The Catholic Church brings to such a conversation the conviction that every human life is sacred, that every person is made in the image and likeness of God and therefore deserving of reverence and protection. That belief is the reason the Catholic Church is the country's largest provider of social services, many aimed at eliminating the systemic poverty and health care insecurity that trap families in a cycle of hopelessness and limit authentic choice.

We also come to this dialogue as Americans, knowing that the principle that all human beings are endowed by the Creator with certain inalienable rights is enshrined in the Declaration of Independence, and that first among these is the right to life.

Make no mistake, because this ruling regrettably will have little impact on abortion in Illinois, as there are virtually no restrictions here, we will continue to advocate strongly for legal protections for unborn children. And we will redouble our efforts to work with all to build a culture that values the inalienable rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness for all.

This ruling is not the end of a journey, but rather a fresh start. It underscores the need to understand those who disagree with us, and to inculcate an ethic of dialogue and cooperation. Let us begin by examining our national conscience, taking stock of those dark places in our society and in our hearts that turn to violence and deny the humanity of our brothers and sisters, and get to work building up the common good by choosing life.

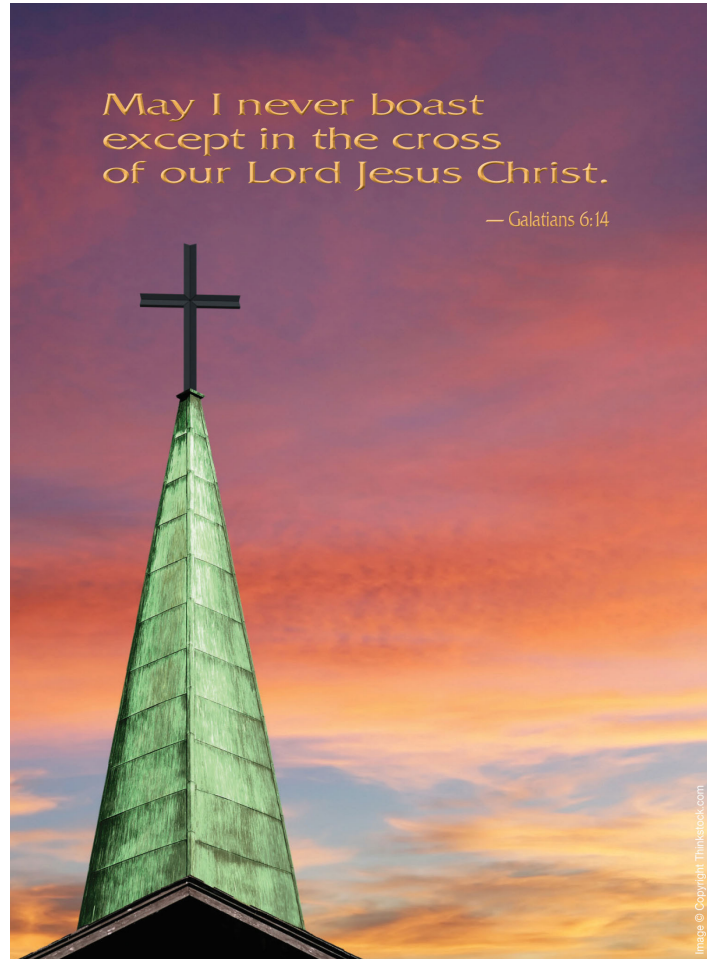
