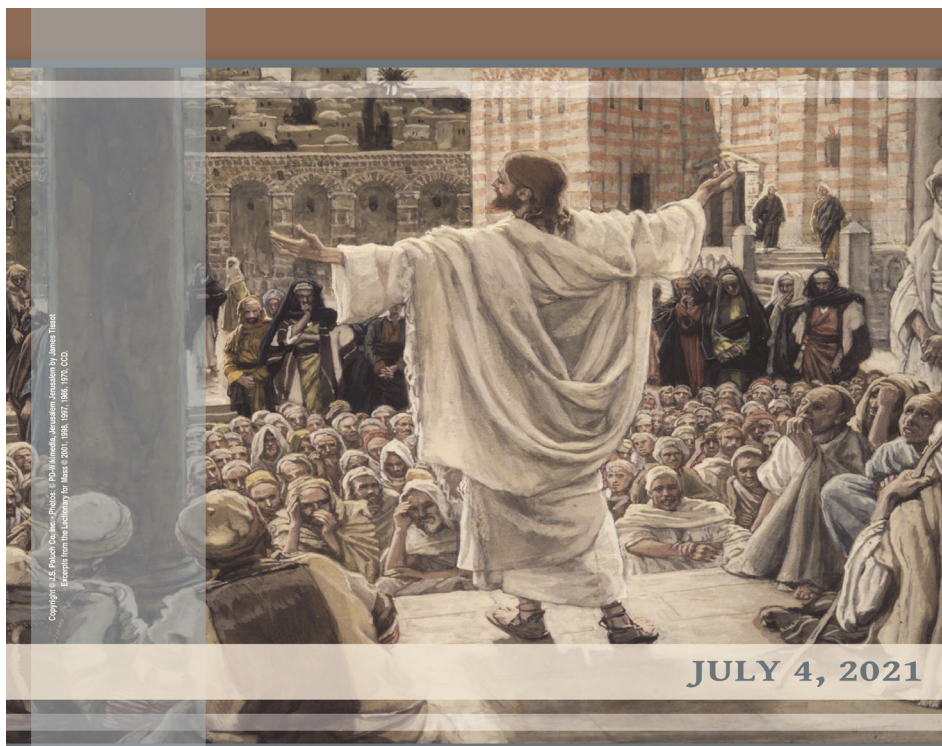

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

I went to college with someone who had a unique way of doing math problems. He always got the right answer, but if you looked at his calculations, no one had any idea how he arrived at the right answer except him. While there might be many ways to solving a math problem, you increase your chances of properly solving it if you follow and apply the proper formulas.

This past winter, I bowled in the Men's Club bowling league. There are many different styles of bowling on display every week. What I noticed though, is that the best bowlers are all very similar in their approach, in the way they release the ball, and the way they follow through. They follow similar strategies in how they aim the ball. Again, while there are many ways of bowling, if you follow the proper fundamentals, you increase your chances for success.

This is not only true of math problems and bowling, but of many other things. There is a proper way to grip a baseball depending on what kind of pitch you want to throw. Gripping the baseball properly increases the chance that the ball will do what you want it to. There are proper fundamentals to shooting a basketball. Following them increases the likelihood that you will make the shot. I think this also applies to us this weekend as we celebrate Independence Day and the freedom we enjoy here in the United States. There is a proper way to exercise our freedom. When we exercise our freedom properly, we increase the chances that it will be of greatest benefit to us and to others.

One way in which we properly exercise freedom is to exercise it with self-control. We sometimes confuse freedom with license. Freedom doesn't mean that we can do whatever we want with little thought of consequence. Freedom doesn't mean we can indulge all our desires without thinking about how others might be affected. The proper exercise of freedom is always with a measure of self-control, a measure of restraint. Properly exercising our freedom means we think before we act, considering the consequences of our choices and how people will be affected by our decisions. When we exercise our freedom with some degree of self-control, it allows for the greatest amount of good and the least amount of harm to result. Using some self-control also prevents us from indulging ourselves and becoming slaves to our desires.

Something else we should realize about freedom is that it is best exercised within the law. The law puts limits on our freedom. The law says there are certain things we can't do and certain lines that cannot be crossed. It may seem to us at times that the law is the enemy of freedom because it imposes limits. I know a lot of people feel this way about religious laws or Church laws. The law exists though, not to prevent us from exercising our freedom, but to ensure that we don't harm ourselves or others through the misuse of our freedom. The law tells us how to use our freedom in a way that serves the common good, what is in the best interest of the greatest number of people. That is the purpose of having laws. Again, even though the law places limits on our freedom, it is within those limits that our freedom can allow for the greatest amount of good and the least amount of harm to result.

We are all happy we live in a country where we are free. We have rights and privileges that people in many other countries do not enjoy. As we give thanks this 4th of July for our country and all the good things we enjoy here, I hope we will give some thought to our freedom and the way we exercise it. Let's try to exercise it properly, with some self-control and within the law. That will help show our gratitude for this great gift. It will also help us exercise our freedom in a way that will be of the greatest benefit to us and to others. Happy 4th of July!
