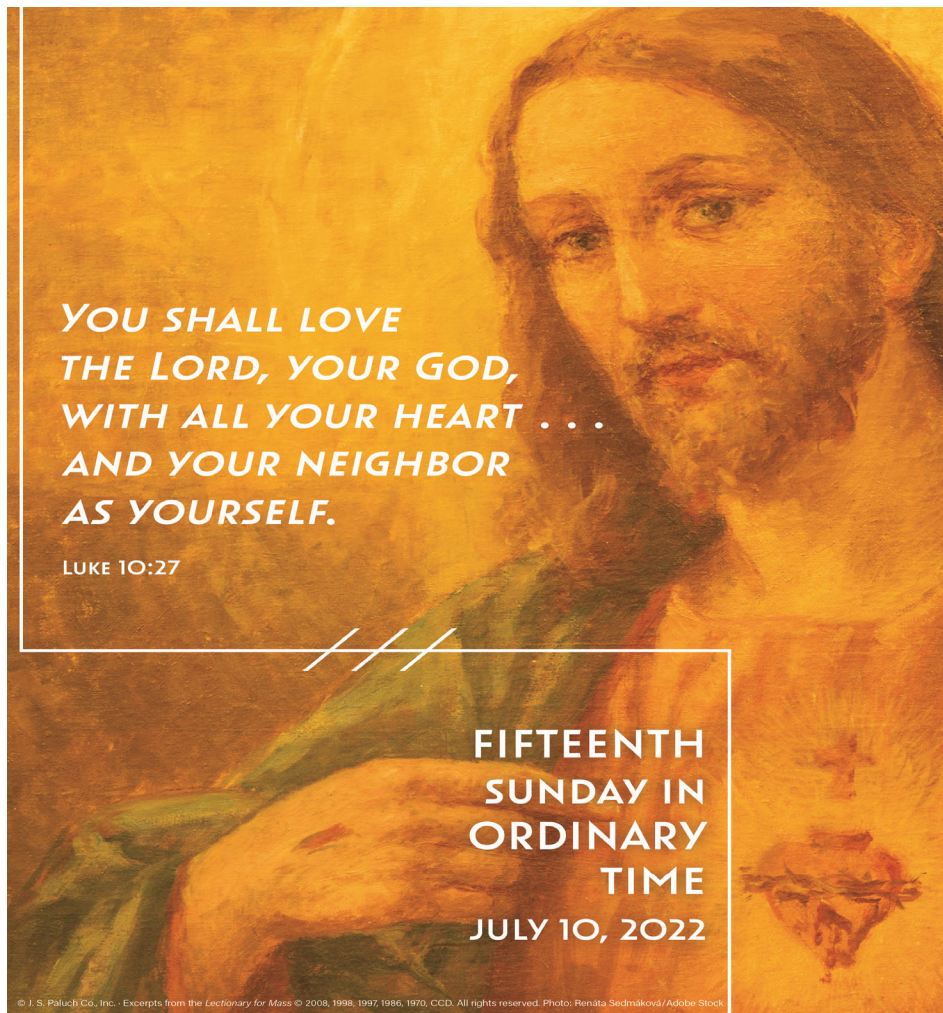

Training can be done on the spot. Your willingness to help will help our Carnival run smoothly. If you are new to the parish, volunteering to help at the Carnival is a great way to begin to get involved in the life of the parish and meet people.

Last year, we had a record Carnival. I'm sure that was due in great part to the fact that our Carnival was the first one to take place after pandemic restrictions lifted enough for us to have a Carnival, and people were anxious to get out and do something. But it was also a great success because we have a dedicated Carnival Committee that worked hard to put last year's Carnival together in a very short period of time. We also had the help of so many of our parishioners who volunteered their time.

While we may not have as profitable a Carnival financially this year as we did last year, our Committee still has been working hard to get things ready for this year's event. We still need your help to make the Carnival a success again this year. Please be willing to volunteer some of your time. It may sound corny to say it, but we won't have "S_CCESS" without "U."

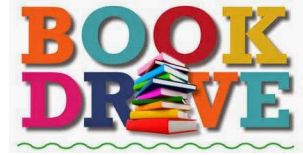

Living our Catholic faith as citizens is no easy business. We each know the challenge in our own consciences to sort through both the complexities of moral issues and the complexities of our imperfect political system. The late Cardinal Joseph Bernardin suggested a way—to be consistent. The “consistent ethic of life” is meant to help us meet those challenges and to prize life—consistently—in every decision we make.
