## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

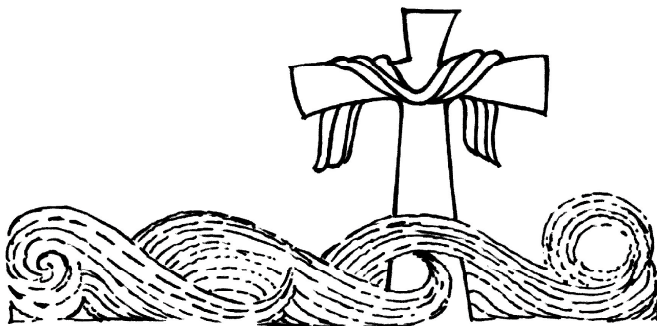
Our annual Parish Carnival concludes this weekend. If you haven't been out to join us yet, I hope we will see you this weekend. If we have already seen you, I hope you will join us again. We will have food, games, and entertainment. There will be a ride special. The beer garden will be open. We will pull the remaining winners in the Grand Raffle. Someone will win \$10,000 on Sunday night. It could be you. Make sure you have your tickets turned in so you will have a chance to win. We will also have the winner of the "Last Queen Standing" provided the last queen hasn't turned up before Sunday night. Please come out and join us. See your friends and neighbors who you may not have seen in a while. Let's make this annual event a success once again.

I was looking through a book about saints recently to find out some information about a saint for morning Mass. I came across another saint who had a feast day this past week on July 20. His story was very interesting. The saint is St. Apollinaris. Apollinaris was sent by St. Peter to the city of Ravenna in Italy to be its first bishop. His preaching of the gospel was so successful that the pagans there beat him and drove him from the city. He returned to Ravenna and was exiled a second time. He preached in the area around Ravenna, then entered the city again. After being cruelly tortured, he was put on a ship heading to Greece. The pagans there caused him to be expelled to Italy, where he went to Ravenna a fourth time. This time, he died from wounds received during a savage beating.

Some of you might remember an old advertising slogan that Timex watches had. The slogan said that Timex watches "take a licking and keep on ticking." That slogan might well apply to St. Apollinaris. How many of us would have continued to preach the gospel if we were treated the way St. Apollinaris was? If we continued to preach the gospel, we would probably make sure we didn't go back to Ravenna after our first visit. Apollinaris was not going to let any persecution or mistreatment keep him from preaching the gospel message entrusted to him.

When we are carrying on our Lord's work or trying to spread His message, we may meet with opposition. People may question us and our motives. People may misunderstand us. They may not listen to us or may even turn against us. What do we do when that happens? Do we give up? Do we change our message, watering it down so it will be easier to accept? Or do we keep on going? There is always some risk involved in following our Lord and carrying on His work. Hopefully, when we encounter opposition or suffering for following our Lord and doing His work we can be like St. Apollinaris. In the face of the difficulties we may encounter because of our faith, let's try to keep on ticking despite any licking we have to endure.

# SNAKES AND SCORPIONS AND PRAYERS? OH, MY!

How often do we hear about snakes and scorpions at Mass? Well, today we do! Jesus uses these frightful (to most of us!) images for their shock value in order to emphasize how graciously and unfailingly our Father in heaven cares for us. The first reading sets the stage for our reflection. Who can hear the story of Abraham negotiating with God in the first reading and not smile at his audacity? The middle Eastern custom of bartering likely honed Abraham's skills in that arena. He even appeals to God's sense of honor, saying, "Far be it from you to do such a thing" [as to wipe out the innocent with the guilty]. Have we not all bargained with God at one time or another when we were desperately in need?

Notice that the very first words of today's Gospel are "Jesus was praying." Of course, the disciples would be curious about a practice that was so central to Jesus' daily life. He was obviously good at it. Perhaps they wanted to know how they could more easily "influence" God themselves! They wanted to know what would work. Luke's version of the beloved Lord's Prayer (one of two found in the Gospels) is highlighted today in response to the disciples' request.

The two parables following the Lord's Prayer teach us about prayer both from the point of view of the one who prays and from God's point of view. The parable of the friend who knocks on the door at midnight illustrates prayer from the point of view someone who urgently needs something. Persistence is the key. The last section of the Gospel offers us a glimpse of prayer from God's point of view. If you seek, you will find; if you knock, the door will be opened. With Jesus as our mediator, we are assured of a hearing before our Father in heaven who is waiting to give good gifts to his children.

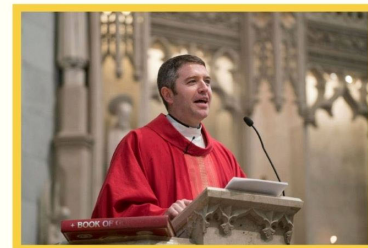
