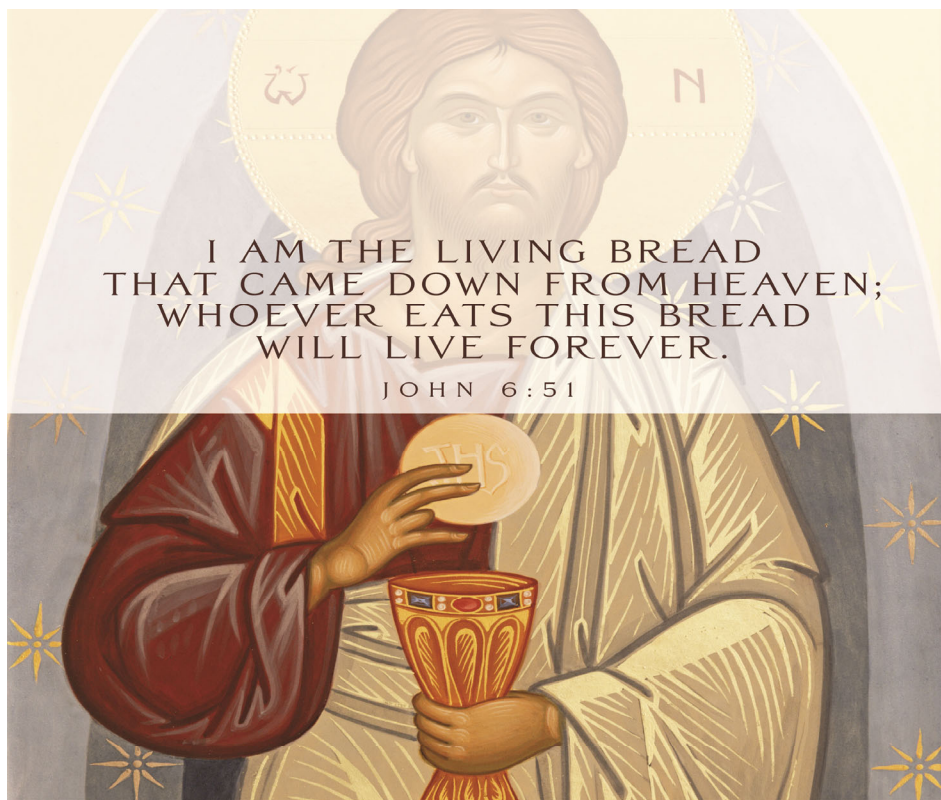


Today's Readings
