A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

When I was a sophomore in high school, a change took place in the math program. Not enough students were taking calculus as seniors, and those who did were not doing very well. So, it was decided that the sophomores on the Honors track would take pre-calculus as juniors, and calculus as seniors. In future years, Honors students would take geometry as freshmen rather than as sophomores and move forward to be better prepared for calculus as seniors. As one of the sophomores affected by this, I asked, "What about Algebra II / Trigonometry?" I was told, "You can go to summer school for it." I was not about to give up a summer of caddying for Algebra II / Trigonometry. I didn't take the class in summer school, and I never did well in math again. I had been an A student in math up to this point. I never got another A in math. It's hard to do well in pre-calculus or calculus when you have no idea what a secant or cotangent is. While my basic math skills are still alright, I wonder how I would have done had I taken that class over the summer. I regret not taking it when I had the chance.

I have some similar academic regret about the books I was supposed to read and never did. Instead of reading Shakespeare, and Dickens, and Kipling, and Edgar Allen Poe like I was supposed to, I chose to read instead books like *Baseball Stars of 1971*. (I did read the Jack London books we were assigned.) I read enough of the assigned books to pass the classes and relied on Cliff's Notes for the rest. I have read a lot of those books since then on my own. But I regret not reading those books when I had the chance to read them and discuss them with a knowledgeable teacher. I was not proud to have to admit to myself when I started college that most of my knowledge of the world's great literature had come from *Classics Illustrated* comic books.

I bring this up because a new school year is beginning. If I could give any advice to students today, it would be to avoid academic regret in your future. Do the work you are supposed to do when you are supposed to do it. Take the classes you need to take in order to succeed. Read the books you are supposed to read when you are supposed to read them so you can discuss them with someone who knows what he or she is talking about. I know it will seem that there are many better ways to spend your time. I certainly thought so. And now I have some academic regret. Try to avoid that in your future.

I hope students will also avoid religious regret. There are many ways as students in which we can not only learn about our faith, but also ingrain habits that will be of benefit for our future lives of faith. There are opportunities as students to make daily prayer, the Mass, and the sacraments a regular part of our lives. When we develop these habits of faith and prayer and worship when we are young, it's easier for them to be part of our lives when we are older. We can suffer from religious regret the same way we can suffer from academic regret, wondering why we didn't form these habits of faith when we were young.

I hope the coming school year will be a successful one for all our students, whatever level of their education they are at. I hope it will be a good year for the families of our students and for all teachers. I especially hope that students will avoid possible academic and religious regret in their futures. I hope they will take advantage of the opportunities to grow in knowledge and in faith that will be presented to them this school year. I hope they will take advantage of those opportunities now so they will avoid any regret about not taking advantage of them in the future.

BEING KNOWN TO GOD

Connections. We have so many in our lives. We have family connections, friend connections, business connections, co-worker connections, acquaintance connections. None of us exists in a vacuum. Somewhere, somehow, we have a connection of some kind.

Several of them run very deep. Our family connections begin as we are shaped as children by all that touches us. We pick up the values of our parents, the art of give and take from our siblings, the joy of selfless love from our grandparents. Hopefully, we take all these good things and pass them on to our children.

Our friend connections sometimes overlap in the family/co-worker areas. We meet unrelated people who somehow touch our hearts and become part of us, too. We share dreams, joys, worries or sorrows. Wherever we may be in our lives, we connect with these friends and they sustain us, comfort us, counsel us, rejoice with us. We are shaped daily by those we spend time with and who mean the most to us.

Did you ever wonder why all these connections affect us so? Because we care. If we didn't, any experiences we'd share with others would just roll off our back, they wouldn't mean a thing. But what empty, hollow people we would be. We need each other.

That leads me to the biggest connection of all, the one that makes all these others possible. Our connection to God. Today's Gospel asks, how many will be saved. But Jesus says, the real question is, WHO will be saved. Many of those outside the door remind Jesus that they ate and drank with him, yet he tells them "I know you not." They did not strive to enter, they never tried to really know him. In other words, no true connection.

But we must be people who are shaped by the God of love. The One who shares our dreams, joys, worries or sorrows. We cannot help but respond because God will sustain us, comfort us, counsel us and rejoice with us!!

Because of that, we are called to shape others so they, too, can connect with God. And one way to do that is by sharing our faith with them. Children especially need to be guided along the right path so that their connection to God is nurtured and grows strong, deep roots.

You can be that person that guides them. I ask you to spend some time in prayer to uncover a calling to be a catechist for the children of our parish. Without others to help them along the way, they may be caught outside the door, unknown to God.
