A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Monday is Labor Day, the final holiday of the summer season. Labor Day has a different feel today. It used to mean that school would be starting a day or two later. Today, most schools have already been in session for a couple of weeks. While Labor Day may not mark the end of summer the way it once did, it's still a day to relax. It's also a time to reflect on work and workers.

In Catholic teaching, work has always carried importance and meaning. Even the smallest, most menial jobs have importance and meaning. Work has this importance and meaning because all work is seen as a share in God's work of creation. God did not give us a finished product when He rested on the seventh day. We carry on God's work of creation through the work we do. That gives a dignity and importance to all work. We should do our work honestly. We should do our work well, to the best of our ability.

The dignity and importance that all work carries as a sharing in God's work of creation also gives importance and dignity to those who do that work. Workers should be treated honestly and fairly. They should be paid justly. They should have safe working conditions. In return, they should put in a full days' work. They should work hard and do their best.

It seems a little odd that we honor work and workers by taking the day off. We can't work all the time. We do need to take a break from our work and rest. Even though we honor work and workers by not working, I hope we will all take some time to think about the work we do and its dignity and importance as a sharing in God's work of creation. Let's also attach the same dignity and importance to those who do that work, whatever it may be. Mass on Labor Day will be at 9:00 AM. Please try to join us. Happy Labor Day!

Even with the Supreme Court's Dobbs decision earlier this summer, the battle for respect for life is far from over. Next Saturday, September 10, is the 10th National Day of Remembrance of Aborted Children. A prayer service will take place at St. Mary Cemetery at 1:00 PM. The prayer service will take place at the burial site of hundreds of aborted babies who were found in a dumpster outside a Michigan Avenue abortion clinic and were later buried at St. Mary Cemetery. The prayer service will last about an hour. All are welcome to join in prayer for the all the children whose lives have been taken, and to pray that human life will one day be respected and legally protected from the moment of conception until the moment when life naturally comes to an end.

Next Sunday, September 11, we will have our annual Mass in the Park. Mass in the Park will take place at Duffy Park at 11:00 AM. This event has always been a favorite of our parishioners. Please plan on joining us at Duffy Park next Sunday at 11:00 AM for Mass.

VILLAGE STREET AND CURB PROJECT

Beginning Wednesday, September 14th, the village will begin work on the streets and curbs around Most Holy Redeemer. As you may have seen along other streets in the neighborhood, during construction, there are holes and trenches, with cones and construction barriers, in the streets and on the sidewalks. Parking and walking in the construction areas is hazardous and should be avoided.

The work will be done in three phases as outlined below (construction dates are weather permitting).

Phase I begins Sept 14: Millard Ave. from 95th to 96th and the north side of 96th from Millard to the west end of Briody Hall. The Millard parking lot entrance will be closed. The Lawndale entrance will be open. *It is recommended that you not park or walk along Millard from 95th to 96th during construction.*

Phase I begins Sept. 19: Lawndale Ave. from just north of the driveway into our parking lot to 96th Street and 96th Street from Lawndale to just west of Briody Hall. The Lawndale Ave. entrance to the parking lot will be closed. The Millard Ave. entrance will be open. *It is recommended that you not park or walk along Lawndale from 95th to 96th during construction.*

Phase III begins Sept. 23: The south side of 96th Street from Millard Ave. to Lawndale Ave. Both parking lot entrances are open during Phase III. *It is recommended that you not park or walk along the south side of 96th street from Lawndale to Millard.*

Weather permitting, all work should be completed by September 28th



BEING PREPARED

For me, summer this year has passed by quicker than any other beforehand. I am sure it is because I am getting older. At least, that's what my dad used to say, 'the older you get, the faster it goes!'

In the past, I knew Fall was approaching when I received THE phone call from my grandkids. As soon as "The List" came out, my phone started ringing off the hook! "Gramma, can you take me school shopping? My mom said she's too busy!" Now, of course, their mom wasn't really busy. They just knew that Gramma would buy the BIG box of crayons, along with lots of other little extras that weren't actually on "the list."

And the truth is, I was happy to take them! It always gave me a wonderful feeling to be able to really be present in the moment with them. We'd slowly stroll up and down the aisle, "List" in hand, making sure we got all the stated requirements. Pens, pencils, folders, and paper were just the beginning. There was also paper towels, Kleenex, anti-bacterial hand wash, Dixie cups and even Lysol wipes!! We would place each precious item in the basket and check it off the "List"...heaven forbid we forgot anything.

The best part, though, was the conversation. I learned who the 'smart' kids were and who the best kids to have on your team in gym class were. I also learned what they liked: having your

best friend sit next to you, and what they didn't like: spelling bees where the whole class saw you fail, or reading out loud when you didn't know all the words. I wished that somehow I could protect them from the hard things, but I knew that it wasn't possible. The best I could do was to prepare them, offer to help them study their vocabulary words and listen to them read and correct their mistakes with only Gramma as witness. Since I could not be with them, preparing them well was the next best solution.

I think that is what Jesus is doing in today's Gospel. He knows how hard the road is going to be for his disciples. He knew that by following him many would be separated from their families and might even lose their lives. To prepare them, he tells them to make a plan so that when the hard times come, they would be successful. Knowing that it would not be possible for him to be with them, this was his next best solution.

As parents—and grandparents—our next best solution for when we are no longer here, is to give our children a grounding in their faith. That way, when times are hard for them, they'll know they can always depend on God to fulfill any needs they may have on their "List."

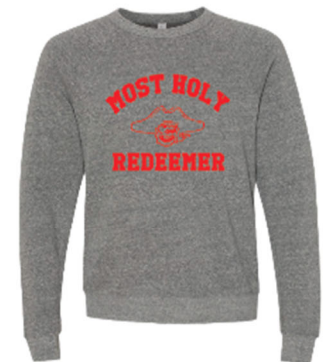
