

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

“What do you want to do THAT for?” That was something I often heard when I told people I was studying to be a priest. Maybe they really wanted to know why I wanted to be a priest. But the way in which it was said often made me feel that people thought there must be something wrong with me because I was thinking about being a priest. Even if I told them I believed God was calling me to this vocation, that never seemed to be enough. The made me feel that there was something wrong with me or that I must be hiding something. It certainly didn't make it easy to answer God's call. Fortunately, I received enough support that I was able to answer God's call.

It wasn't easy to answer God's call 41 years ago, and that was at a time when religion and Church played a greater part in people's lives than is true today. I think it must be even harder for men who feel called to the priesthood today. Not only are religion and Churchless important in the lives of so many today, but when you look at what our culture values and feels is important, you're not going to be considered a success by becoming a priest.

This weekend is Seminarian Sunday in the Archdiocese of Chicago. We are asked to show our support for those who are studying for the priesthood. We are certainly asked to give our financial support. But I would suggest that our verbal support and encouragement are even more important. If you meet someone who is studying for the priesthood, don't ask, “What do you want to do THAT for?” or if you do, ask it in a way that isn't going to make him feel there must be something wrong with him. Try to be supportive and encouraging. Ensure him of your prayers for him. That can make it a little easier to answer God's call. The same thing is true if you are a parent and one of your children expresses interest in a religious vocation. How you react to that can make the difference in whether your child answers God's call. It's sad that many seminarians today report that they receive little support from their families for their vocation. I don't think I would be a priest today if I did not have support form my family. We also might want to think about how we speak about the Church and priests and religious in our homes. A child might be thinking about a religious vocation but may not have mentioned it yet. The Church is not perfect. Priests and religious are not perfect either. But if all a child hears are negative comments, we might be discouraging vocations.

I hope we will support all those studying for the priesthood. I hope we will be generous in our financial support his weekend. I hope we will pray for those studying for the priesthood and religious life. I hope we will pray for those God is calling to the priesthood and religious life, that they will answer God's call. Let's also try to make sure we offer our verbal support and encouragement when we get the chance. That can make the biggest difference of all in someone answering the call to the priesthood or religious life.

This Sunday, we also celebrate Catechetical Sunday. Catechetical Sunday honors all those engaged in catechesis, the teaching ministry of the Church. Catechetical Sunday always ties in with the start of a new school year and the beginning of parish religious education programs for another year. We honor all those who teach in our schools and religious education programs. We honor those engaged in baptismal preparation, marriage preparation, RCIA programs, and youth ministry.

While we recognize all engaged in official catechesis, we also should keep in mind that we all engage in unofficial catechesis. Parents do this by being religious leaders in their families. We do this when we take our faith out into the world with us and let people see the difference it makes in our lives. We should also keep in mind that we can't catechize others unless we are catechized ourselves. We need to continue to learn more about our faith and grow in our understanding of it. This is a lifelong task. It's not something that ends when we finish 8th grade. As we honor all those engaged in official catechesis this Sunday, let's also keep in mind that we all engage in unofficial catechesis. Let's also try to take advantage of some of the opportunities given to us, whether through reading, classes we take, our programs we take part in, to be catechized and continue to grow in our knowledge and understanding of our Catholic faith.

VILLAGE STREET AND CURB PROJECT

Beginning Wednesday, September 14th, the village will begin work on the streets and curbs around Most Holy Redeemer. As you may have seen along other streets in the neighborhood, during construction, there are holes and trenches, with cones and construction barriers, in the streets and on the sidewalks. Parking and walking in the construction areas is hazardous and should be avoided.

The work will be done in three phases as outlined below (construction dates are weather permitting).

Phase I begins Sept 14: Millard Ave. from 95th to 96th and the north side of 96th from Millard to the west end of Briody Hall. The Millard parking lot entrance will be closed. The Lawndale entrance will be open. *It is recommended that you not park or walk along Millard from 95th to 96th during construction.*


Phase II begins Sept. 19: Lawndale Ave. from just north of the driveway into our parking lot to 96th Street and 96th Street from Lawndale to just west of Briody Hall. The Lawndale Ave. entrance to the parking lot will be closed. The Millard Ave. entrance will be open. *It is recommended that you not park or walk along Lawndale from 95th to 96th during construction.*

Phase III begins Sept. 23: The south side of 96th Street from Millard Ave. to Lawndale Ave. Both parking lot entrances are open during Phase III. *It is recommended that you not park or walk along the south side of 96th street from Lawndale to Millard.*

Weather permitting, all work should be completed by September 28th


