A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Next Saturday at the 4:30 PM Mass, we will celebrate the Communal Anointing of the Sick. All sick and elderly parishioners are invited to attend and receive this sacrament of God's healing. The Anointing of the Sick sometimes will bring physical healing to the one who receives it. What it always brings is spiritual healing. Through this sacrament, the sick know that God is with them in their illness. They know that they are not alone. They have the prayers and support of the members of their parish and of all the Church. They also receive the graces to bear their illness well, with hope of recovery and not taking it out on others. If you are unable to join us next Saturday but would still like to receive the Anointing of the Sick, please call the rectory (708-425-5354) so arrangements can be made for you to receive this sacrament in your home.

Something to keep in mind is that this sacrament is for anyone who is ill or older and more susceptible to illness. If someone is sick and wants to be anointed, this should be done as soon as possible. Many people still wait until death is imminent before they ask for the Anointing of the Sick. The problem with this is that with fewer priests today, it might be difficult to find someone if you wait until the very end. Also, receiving the sacrament while still cognizant can help the one receiving it even more. If a loved one needs to be anointed, please try to get in touch with us as soon as possible.

October is Respect Life Month. One of the ways we will observe Respect Life Month is by taking part in the Baby Bottle Project as we have in previous years. The Baby Bottle Project benefits the Women's Centers in their life-saving work. To take part, all you have to do is pick up a plastic baby bottle in church, take it home, fill it with your spare change during the month of October, and bring the bottle back to church at the end of the month. Your support of the Baby Bottle Project will help the Women's Centers to help mothers in crisis pregnancy situations to choose life for their unborn children.

Thank you to everyone who attended the *Renew My Church* meeting this past Wednesday. Thank you for taking the time to find out more about this initiative. Thank you for your questions and comments. Please continue to check the bulletin for more information about *Renew My Church* as we move forward.

Every year, parishes in the Archdiocese are asked to count the number of people who attend Mass each Sunday in October. The October Mass Count numbers are very important and are the first thing the Archdiocese looks at when making long range plans about the future of a parish. If you were at the *Renew My Church* meeting on Wednesday or read the material in the bulletin last weekend, you know how important this number is. We did not do an October Count last year because of the pandemic. We are being asked to do an October Mass Count this year. I know we are not back to our full Mass schedule yet and are still dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sunday. Many people have yet to return to Sunday Mass because of the pandemic. I hope though, that we will try to attend Mass each Sunday in October this year. We should attend Mass every Sunday, but given the importance of the October Mass Count, I hope we will make an extra effort to attend Mass each Sunday during October and to attend Mass at Most Holy Redeemer.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

In our Catholic tradition there are two sacraments of healing: **Reconciliation** and **Anointing of the Sick**. Both sacraments are concerned with restoring a person to health – spiritual and physical.

Our source for the sacramental ministry to the sick is James 5:14-15

“Is anyone among you sick? Let them summon the presbyters of the church and they should pray over and anoint the sick with oil in the name of the Lord. The prayer of faith will save the sick and the Lord will raise them up. Have they committed any sins? They will be forgiven.”

The **Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick** will take place here at Most Holy Redeemer on Saturday, October 2nd at the 4:30 afternoon Mass. People suffering from both short and long term illness are encouraged to receive this wonderful sacrament which confers the graces necessary to face serious health issues with strength, courage and peace.

Please sit anywhere you choose in the church. When directed to do so, all those wishing to receive the sacrament will approach one of the priests who will be standing outside the altar rail. Please say ‘Amen’ after the priest has anointed your head and again after he has anointed your hands.

BABY BOTTLE PROJECT

Beginning on October 4, 2021, our parish will be participating in The Baby Bottle Project benefiting The Women’s Centers of Greater Chicagoland. This non-profit organization directly assists mothers and families experiencing crisis pregnancies by offering emotional, financial, material, and spiritual support through counseling, clothing & monetary provisions, prayer, and other aid. By God’s Grace, The Women’s Centers have saved over 40,000 babies—and their mothers—from abortion since opening in 1984.

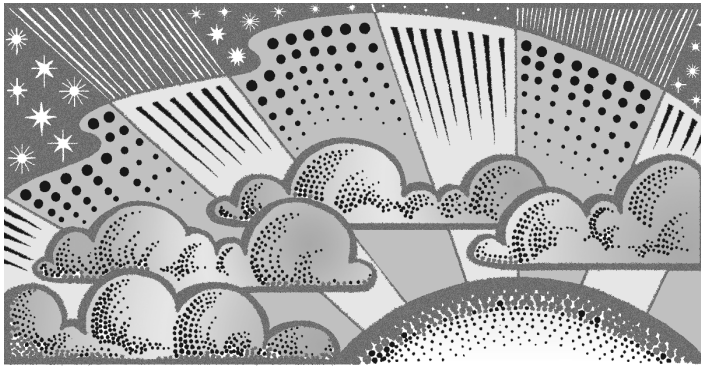

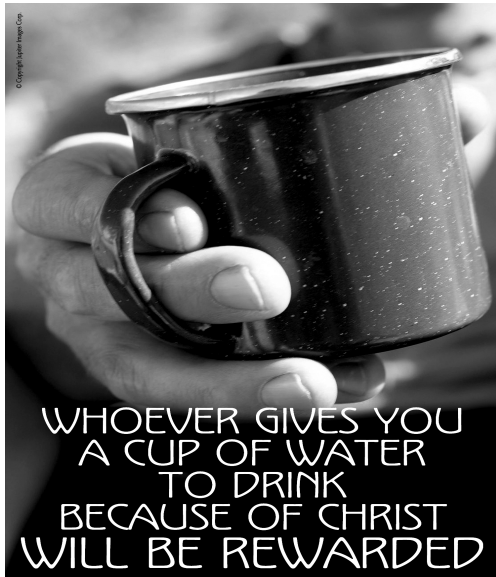
