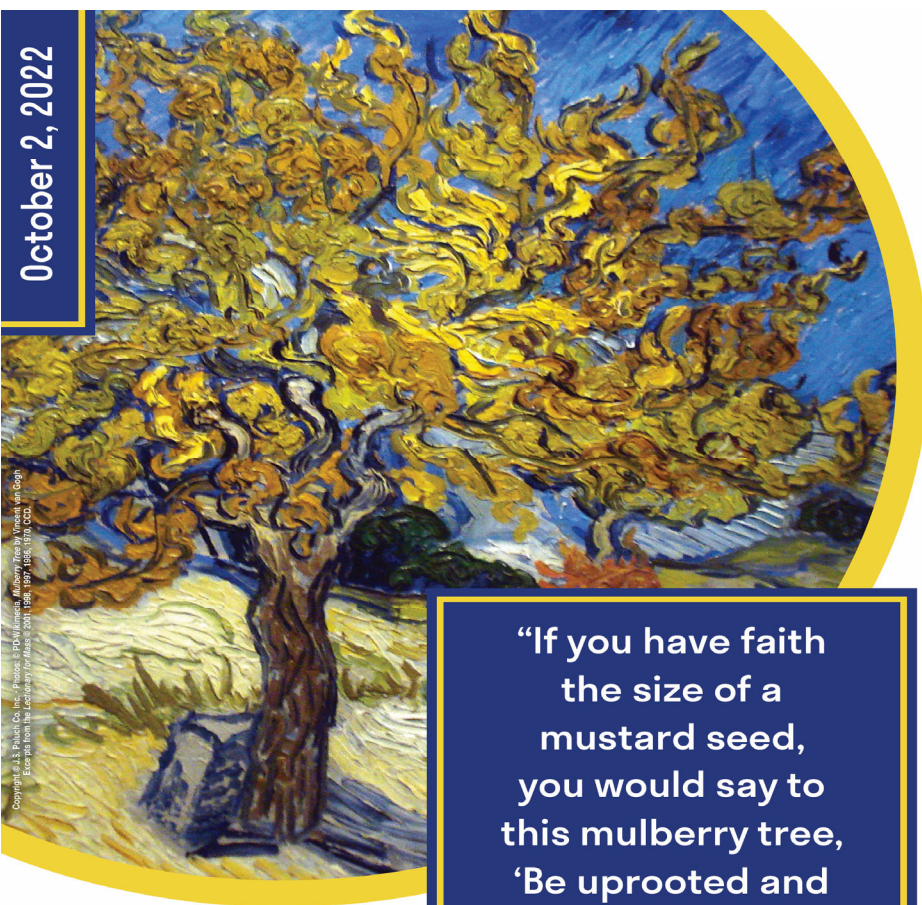

MISSION STATEMENT

We, the family of Most Holy Redeemer Parish, commit ourselves to enriching our relationship with God by following the teachings of Jesus Christ. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

This past summer, in the *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization* decision, the Supreme Court overturned both the *Roe v. Wade* and *Planned Parenthood v. Casey* decisions. This decision did not outlaw abortion across the country. What it did was to remove a federal right to abortion and return to the states the full power to regulate any aspect of abortion not preempted by federal law. This means that some states will continue to allow abortion with few or no restrictions. Others will restrict abortion to some degree, maybe even prohibiting them altogether.

As we begin Respect Life Month and celebrate Respect Life Sunday this weekend, it also doesn't mean that we can now sit back and take it easy if we believe that all lives are sacred and should be protected from the moment of conception until the moment when life naturally comes to an end. There is still much that we should do.

One thing we should do is to educate ourselves. We shouldn't just educate ourselves about what takes place in abortion and euthanasia. We shouldn't just educate ourselves about issues surrounding the elderly, or terminally ill, or mentally or physically handicapped. One complaint I have heard since the *Dobbs* decision is that people who claim to be pro-life are really just pro-birth. They don't care about the baby or the mother once the baby is born. We need to educate ourselves about all the help that is available for mothers who choose to give birth and for their babies. Help is available through organizations like the Courage Program, the Women's Center, and Southside Women's Services to help with food, clothing, housing, medical care, finishing school, finding a job, and more. We can help mothers choose life, and answer critics, when we have that information.

We should also pray. We can pray that life will be respected. We can pray for those considering abortion or euthanasia, that God will inspire them to choose life instead. With an election coming up in just over a month, we can consider where candidates stand on these issues when we cast our ballots. We can also be careful about how we speak. One of the reasons life is not respected is that those who do not respect life have framed the discussion. The way we speak about having and raising children or caring for the sick, disabled, or elderly often shows a negative outlook. These lives are seen as a burden. They interfere with our lives, schedules, or budgets. Let's try to make sure we speak about these lives instead as a blessing and gift from God. Let's make sure we see them as such.

The *Dobbs* decision, while important, only goes to show there is still a great deal of work to be done if we want all human lives to have the respect they should. Let's try to do something to further respect for life, especially during this Respect Life Month.

Tuesday, October 4, is the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. Francis was known for seeing God in the created world and in all life. In honor of St. Francis, we will have our annual Blessing of Pets on Tuesday at 4:00 PM in the parking lot. All pets of the parish and their owners are invited to attend.

A donation of \$51,000 was received from the MHR School Foundation this past week for the new roof on the school. This is a big help in paying for the roof. We want to thank the Foundation for this generous gift and for their fundraising efforts to raise the money. It is greatly appreciated.


