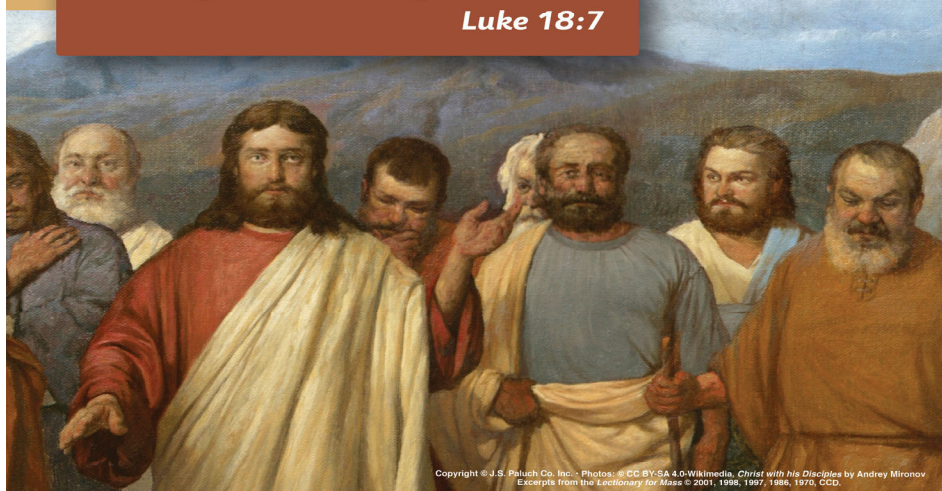

## **A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

This past Tuesday, there was a meeting for all the priests of the Archdiocese. At the beginning of the meeting, as we said the opening prayer, we were reminded that Tuesday was the 60th anniversary of the beginning of the Second Vatican Council. The Second Vatican Council was a significant moment in the life of the Church. 60 years after it began, it would be good to take another look at it.

When Pope John XXIII, now St. John XXIII, called for the Council, he did it because of what he saw in the world, the signs of the times. He saw a Europe that had been decimated by two world wars. He saw the increasing threat of Communism. He saw a growing atheism and scientific advances that were making people question their faith. John XXIII saw a need for the Church to update her teaching. He wasn't calling for the Church to abandon various teachings as much as to present the teaching of Christ and the Church in a new way, a way that would speak to the people of today so they could more readily accept the teaching of Christ and put their faith in Him.

John XXIII used the famous image of "Opening up the windows to let some fresh air into the Church." Opening up the windows brought a lot of change into the Church. Those changes are perhaps most readily seen in the changes that took place in the liturgy. There were many others though. The Council initiated dialogue with other Christian churches, dialogue that had not previously taken place. We began to look for common ground with other faiths. The talents and abilities of lay people were recognized. The laity became more involved in ministry in their parishes, serving now as lectors, Eucharistic ministers, and Ministers of Care. So much of what we see people doing in the way of ministry in the Church today came out of the Second Vatican Council. Consultative bodies such as Parish Pastoral Councils, parish school boards, and finance councils all came from the Council.

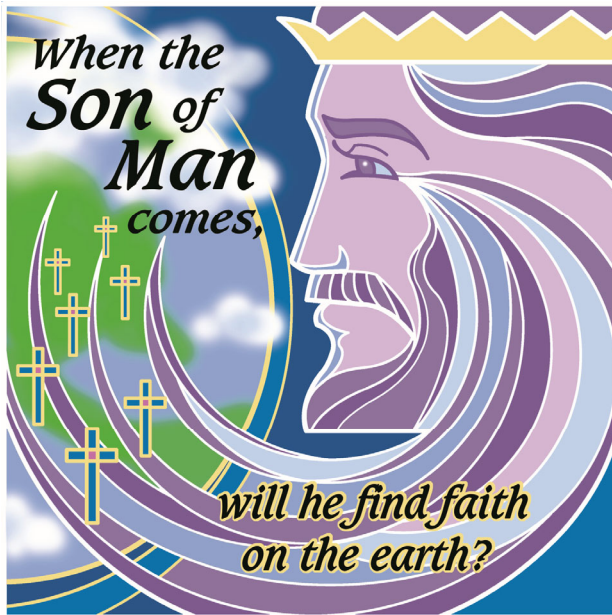
Opening up the windows to let some fresh air into the Church certainly brought about many changes. But you don't just open a window to let something in. You also open a window to let something out. John XXIII hoped the Church would be reinvigorated by the Council. Updating teaching to present it in a new way was to renew and strengthen the faith of each member of the Church. We could then go out into the world to transform it as the Church once had done. While in recognition of the talents and abilities of lay people they became more active and involved in ministry within the Church, the Council also stated that, "The role of the laity is to transform the world." Catholics were to take their faith out into the world with them and through their faith transform the business world, the political realm, entertainment, medicine, law, the arts, education, the culture, and the world. We were to Christianize the world, making the Kingdom of God more of a reality here on earth.

If we take a look at our world today, this transformation of the world that we were supposed to bring about through our renewed faith has yet to take place. This remains the great unfinished work of the Second Vatican Council. 60 years after the Council began, I hope we will all reflect on this great work that has yet to be done. Maybe we need to do a few things to strengthen and renew our own faith first. I hope we will all think about this a little bit. What can we do to help bring about the transformation of the world that the Council desired, the transformation of the world more and more into the Kingdom of God here on earth?

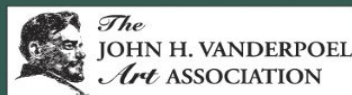
