MISSION STATEMENT

We, the family of Most Holy Redeemer Parish, commit ourselves to enriching our relationship with God by following the teachings of Jesus Christ. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

“Holy Mary, Mother of God....pray for us. St. John the Baptist....pray for us. St. Joseph....pray for us. Saint Peter and St. Paul....pray for us.” That is part of the Litany of the Saints that is prayed as a part of every baptism. Through the Litany, we invoke the saints on behalf of the one being baptized, especially that person’s patron saints.

Even more than invoking the saints on behalf of the one being baptized, the Litany of the Saints as part of baptism reminds us of something else. Through baptism, we become members of the family of God, the Church. Our membership in the Church is not just limited to the members of the Church here on earth. The Litany of the Saints reminds us there is a larger Church we become part of through baptism. Baptism unites us with the other members of the Church here on earth. It also unites us with the saints in heaven. It also unites us with those who one day will be saints in heaven, the souls in purgatory. This larger family of God we belong to is called the Communion of Saints.

Every year, on November 1, All Saints Day, and November 2, All Souls Day, we remember that we belong to the Communion of Saints. All Saints Day honors all the saints in heaven. This is not just a day for officially recognized saints. This is a day for ALL the saints in heaven, most of whom are people just like us, some of whom we may even know. All Saints Day reminds us that God wants all of us to be saints in heaven one day. When we think that the saints we honor on this feast are people no different from us, it also lets us know that being in heaven one day and being saints ourselves is definitely within the realm of possibility.

On All Souls Day, we remember the souls in purgatory. The souls in purgatory will one day be among the saints in heaven. They are undergoing final purification in purgatory. The souls in purgatory are unable to help themselves attain the life of heaven. By the prayers and good works we offer for them, we can help them attain the life of heaven sooner. When they are among the saints, they will pray for us and intercede for us.

All Saints Day is a holy day of obligation. Even though the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass that has been in place since the pandemic started has not been lifted, we will still have an additional Mass at 7:30 PM on Tuesday evening for those who wish to attend. On Wednesday evening, there will be a Mass at 7:30 PM to remember all those from our parish family who died this past year. All are welcome to join us for this Mass. You are encouraged to return your All Souls Day envelope. Returning this envelope and listing on it the names of your departed loved ones will enroll them in the Purgatorial Society. They will be remembered at the Masses on All Souls Day and at Mass every Monday morning during the year.

In recent months, we have had over 3,000 people arrive in Chicago who are seeking political asylum. There will be more. These are people who have entered the country legally. All parishes have been asked to take up a second collection the weekend of November 5-6 to aid these asylum seekers. The money collected will go to Catholic Charities, who will lead the efforts to aid these asylum seekers. There are no special envelopes for this collection. Please read the letter from the Cardinal about this collection that is in the bulletin this week. Please try to be generous in your support.

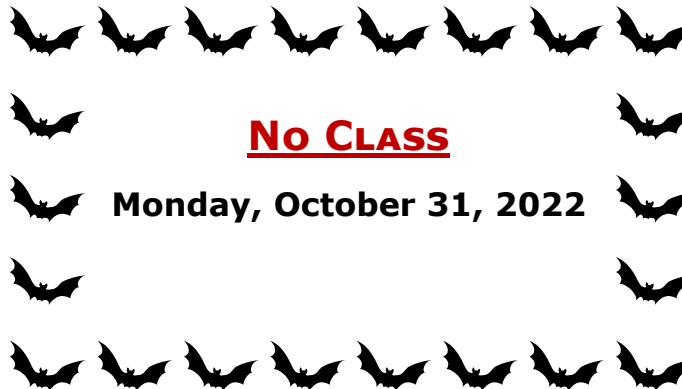
Mass of Enrollment

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

The sudden and unexpected influx of men, women and children seeking asylum to U.S cities, including Chicago, over recent weeks has presented our community with significant challenges but also significant opportunities to share God's message of compassion and joy. The plight of these asylum seekers, most of whom are fleeing violence, political oppression and crushing poverty in their home countries causes us grave concern, but I am convinced that this is a moment for us to join together in a mission of love and mercy.

Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in our city as of mid-October. Almost all the migrants we have welcomed report that they plan to stay in the Chicago area and will need support to reestablish their lives. Unlike other migrants, most do not have relatives in the States with whom they can live and learn as they build new lives.

The Catholic community has shown an outpouring of compassion as churches, religious congregations, and other ministries have opened their doors, and Catholic Charities has deployed a team to connect people with loved ones and conduct initial needs assessments. Across the Church, many parishes have responded, and more help is needed. We have mobilized to create a coordinated Catholic response to assist asylum seekers so we might maximize the impact of our assistance as we bear witness to our faith. A Working Group has gathered to evaluate opportunities to serve. We are considering several options including transitional shelter, parish sponsorships, and pastoral care for asylum seekers.

In support of these efforts, parishes throughout the Archdiocese will hold a second collection for asylum seekers at all Masses celebrated the weekend of November 5-6. The commitment of faithful Catholics like you will help ensure the success of this mission. Please consider giving to this collection or giving directly to Catholic Charities which will serve as a central gathering point for donations. 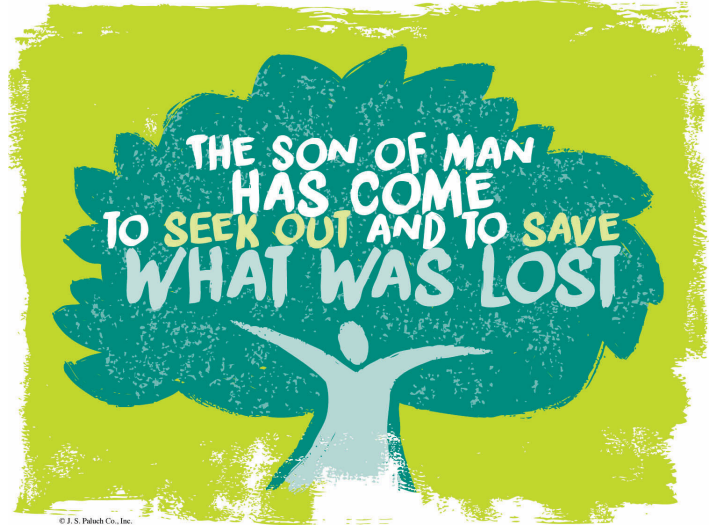
