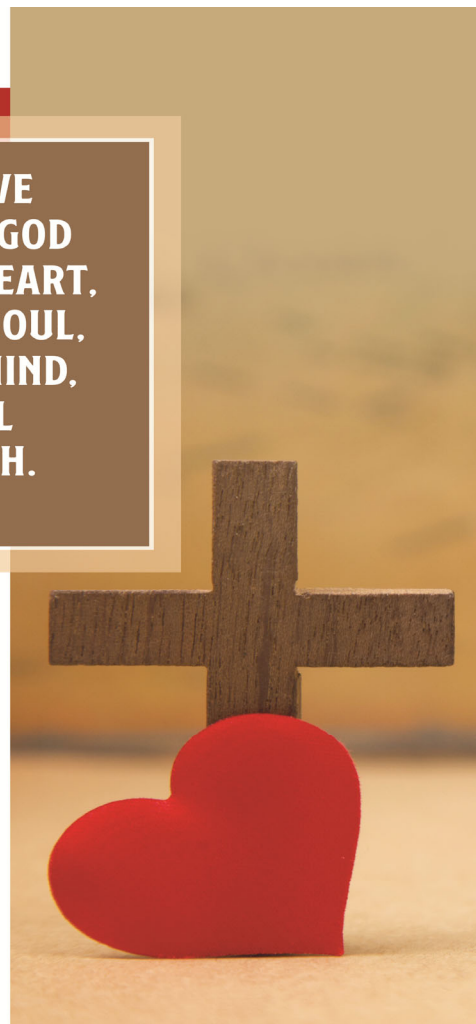

MISSION STATEMENT

We, the family of Most Holy Redeemer Parish, commit ourselves to enriching our relationship with God by following the teachings of Jesus Christ. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

“The Communion of Saints” is one of the truths of our faith we express our belief in every time we pray the Apostles’ Creed. Through baptism, we become members of the Church. Baptism united us with all the members of the Church throughout the world. But our membership in the Church is not just limited to the members of the Church here on earth. The Church also includes the saints in heaven and the souls in purgatory, who are awaiting their entrance into heaven. This larger Church we are part of is what we mean by the Communion of Saints. Every year, on All Saints Day and All Souls Day, we express our belief in the Communion of Saints.

On November 1, All Saints Day, we honor ALL the saints in heaven. This does not include only those who are officially recognized by the Church as saints. It includes EVERYONE who is in heaven and is considered a saint. It is not a day for the famous saints as much as a day for the not so famous saints. These might be members of our families, or people we worked with or went to school with. They might be friends of ours or people who were our neighbors. They are people who tried their best to follow our Lord here on earth and do His work. They are people just like us who are now in heaven and are considered saints. This feast lets us know that what God wants is for all of us to one day be in heaven and considered saints ourselves. When we think about the people we honor this day, it reminds us that you don’t have to be perfect to be a saint. It’s possible that we can one day be saints ourselves.

All Saints Day is usually a holy day of obligation. In a decision the bishops of the United States made years ago in most dioceses, when All Saints Day falls on a Monday or Saturday, the obligation to attend Mass is lifted. That is also true this year because we are still dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass because of the pandemic. Therefore, there will only be one Mass this year on All Saints Day, at 8:30 AM. The school children will attend this Mass.

On November 2, All Souls Day, we remember the souls in purgatory. The souls in purgatory are waiting to enter heaven. They can no longer do anything to help themselves in this regard. We can help them by the prayers and good works we offer for them. While we at times speak of “the poor souls in purgatory,” purgatory is actually a merciful doctrine. The souls in purgatory are going to heaven. While they do suffer, I think it’s more the suffering of not being in heaven yet, and also knowing that had they done some things differently in this life, they would already be in heaven. In addition to our morning Mass on All Souls Day, there will also be a special mass on Tuesday evening at 7:30 PM at which we will remember all the members of our parish who died this past year. All are welcome to attend this Mass.

While we especially remember the souls in purgatory on All Souls Day, we pray for them throughout the year. Returning your All Souls Day envelope and listing your deceased loved ones on it will enroll them in the Purgatorial Society. They will be remembered in the Masses on All Souls Day, and at Mass on every Monday morning throughout the year.

I will be away from November 3 – 19. While I am away, Fr. Ronald Mahon, C.Pp.S, will be assisting with our Masses and other services. Fr. Mahon is a retired member of the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. He currently resides with his sister in Oak Lawn. In addition to assisting with Masses and other services while I’m away, he will also be staying in the rectory, so Fr. Adamich is not alone. I hope we will all make Fr. Mahon feel welcome.
