A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

If you partially fill a glass with water or some other liquid, then hold it up and ask someone whether the glass is half-empty or half-full, how that person answers reveals a lot about how that person tends to look at life. A “half-full” person would tend to be more optimistic and see the positive aspects of life and the good things one has and enjoys. A “half-empty” person would tend to be more pessimistic, seeing the negative aspects of life and all that is lacking.

This coming Thursday, we will celebrate Thanksgiving Day. More than a day for eating turkey and gathering with family and friends or watching football, Thanksgiving Day asks us, “Is the glass half-empty or half-full?” How we answer says a lot about us and whether or not we are grateful people.

We can see a lot of negatives about our country. Do we also see the positives? Do we see the freedom we enjoy and the many positives in our lives because we are fortunate enough to live here? Are we thankful for the blessings in our lives? We complain a lot about our jobs. We see the negatives about our work. Do we also see the positives? As much as we complain, are we even more thankful that we have jobs so we can care for our families and ourselves? We complain about so many people in our lives. While there certainly are many people who make life difficult, can we see that our glass is also filled with people who make life so much better for us, people who love us and care about us, who are there to help us, who comfort us and console us, and who add so much to our enjoyment of life? We can see the glass as half-full when it comes to the homes we live in, the food we eat, the cars we drive, and the clothes we wear. Someone always seems to have it so much better than we do when it comes to these things. Can we also see the glass as being more full than empty in the sense that we recognize that while other people may have it better, we still have a roof over our heads and food to eat and clothes to wear and cars to drive? So many in our world lack these things.

As we celebrate Thanksgiving Day this Thursday, I hope we see our glass as much more full than empty. I hope that despite what we lack, we will see all that we do have and are blessed with. I hope we will also see God as the source of our blessings and be sure to thank our Lord for all we have been blessed with. One good way to do that would be to join us for Mass at 9:00 AM on Thanksgiving Day. If we do remember that all our blessings come from God, we should also use those blessings as God would want. Our blessings are meant to be shared with other people for their benefit. Maybe we can use our blessings in this way and help fill up someone else’s glass a little more by sharing our material blessings with those who have less than we do or by being a friend to someone who doesn’t have many, or any, and could use one. Happy Thanksgiving!

The Archdiocese recently announced that the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and holy days that has been in place since the pandemic started is being lifted. Beginning the First Sunday of Advent, we will again have the obligation to attend Sunday Mass in person. Please keep in mind that if you are still very concerned about your susceptibility to COVID, your concerns do matter. If you are still very concerned about catching the virus, you are not obligated to be here until you are ready. The vast majority of us though, have returned to our normal activities and way of life. That means it’s also time to return to Mass. I look forward to seeing you next weekend.

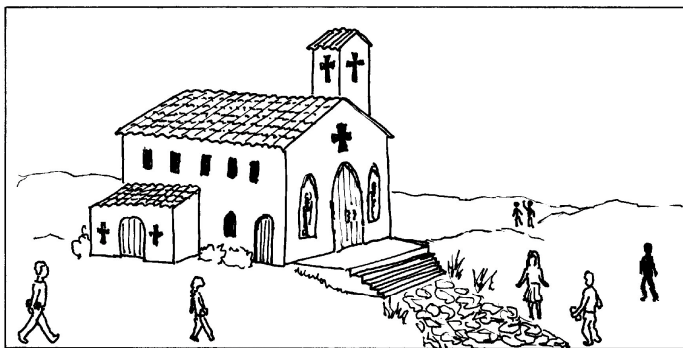

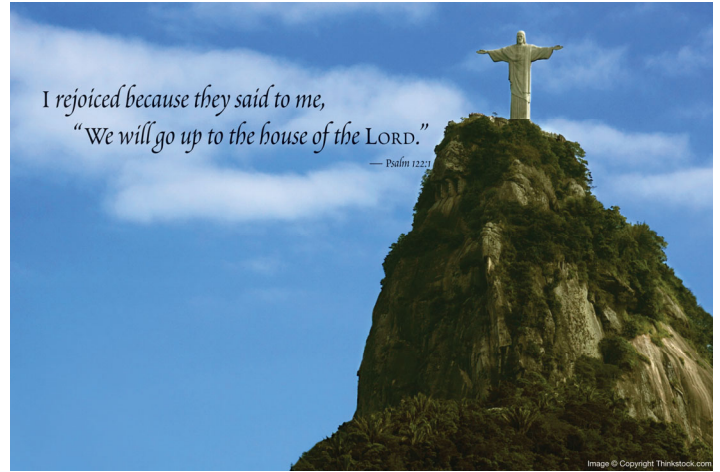
