A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

This week's bulletin contains a copy of the parish financial report for the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2021. I apologize that you are seeing this at such a late date. Normally, we try to make the report available to our parishioners in the fall. I wish I could blame this on the pandemic, but I can't. There were a lot of other concerns, such as *Renew My Church*, and the report just got put aside.

I want to make a few comments about the report, but first I want to say, "Thank you." Thank you to all our parishioners who so faithfully and generously support our parish. It is always appreciated but even more so during this pandemic year. Fewer people at Mass means less in the collection basket. We had so many people though, who were faithful about dropping their envelopes off at the rectory or who began electronic giving that it helped to offset some of the loss from people not being at Mass.

Considering the effects of the pandemic on Mass attendance, fundraising, and parish activities, we had a pretty good year overall. Our overall church operating income was only down about \$3,500 from the previous year. Collections were down a bit, but we did have an increase in special donations people gave and other income. We did have a very successful Carnival last summer, but it took place after June 30, so it is not included in this report. Our church operating expenses were down about \$44,000 from the previous year. A lot of that was due to a reduction in salaries and benefits. Fr. Paul went from being paid by the parish to being paid by the government when he went on active duty, so there was some savings there. With parish meetings and activities not taking place, the high school receptionists were not working. School of Religion tuition and fees were down. This was due to people opting out of the School of Religion due to the on-line classes. You might have thought that without meetings and other activities taking place the utilities and maintenance costs would go down. They did, but not as much as you might think due to all the additional cleaning supplies we had to purchase. Even with expenses going down, we were still at a deficit on the church side.

On the school side, tuition and fees were down a little over \$130,000 from the previous year. We had fewer students last year because of the pandemic, mainly because a good number of parents chose not to enroll their children in pre-school due to the pandemic. The pandemic also greatly curtailed school fundraising efforts. School income was down a little over \$190,000. Expenses were down about \$164,000. Salaries and benefits were down mainly due to a reduction in fringe benefits and a few staffing changes. The reduction in fringe benefits was due to the pandemic. Those benefits are going to be back in place next year. There was a savings on our utility costs because athletic events were not taking place. Again, that savings was offset a bit by the increased cleaning we had to do in order to keep the school safe for in-person learning. Unfortunately, the school ended up operating at a deficit of \$238,554. Combined with the church deficit, we had a total operating deficit of \$260,106.

The good news is that our extraordinary income was able to cover the deficit. We were fortunate enough to receive two PPP loans that amounted to over \$840,000. That, combined with the returns on our parish investments allowed us to cover all our costs for the year. The bad news is that we will probably not be receiving another PPP loan. Extraordinary income does fluctuate. If you remove the PPP loans from the extraordinary income, we would be in a big financial hole. Please keep in mind that a lot of the money listed as extraordinary income is earmarked and can only be used for specific purposes.

I think this illustrates just how important the Sunday collection is. That is income we can count on from week to week. More than any fundraisers, that is what keeps our parish going. This will be even more important as we move forward with *Renew My Church*. It will be up to us to keep our parish on solid financial footing. A big part of that will be getting people to come back to Mass. Even with more people giving electronically, the number of people in church on Sunday makes a big difference in the collection.

MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR CONT.

We also have to continue to try to give generously. We have a new roof to put on the school this summer. It's also looking more and more like we are going to have to do a complete resurfacing of the parking lot in the near future. Your continued support makes a big difference for these and other projects. Again, thank you to all who so generously support our parish. We hope you will continue to do so.

Most Holy Redeemer will be taking part in the South Side Irish Parade next Sunday. We will have a trolley going to and from the parade. If you would like to be on the trolley, please call the rectory to reserve a seat. Space is limited. If you want to march with us, we are number 24 in the parade lineup. We will assemble on the northwest corner of 103rd and Artesian, right by the tennis courts at Beverly Park. The parade committee has asked that marching groups stay together and try to march in an orderly fashion. So maybe think twice about bringing scooters and rollerblades.

During the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2021, parish activities, including how we attend Mass changed, were modified, or cancelled due to the Pandemic and CDC guidelines meant to limit transmission of the Covid-19 virus. As with the prior fiscal year, these changes had an impact on parish revenue streams. Most notably, the Parish Carnival was postponed until late July, which is our next fiscal year, and we also saw a decline in tuition and fees and other school fundraising. While the parish on a consolidated basis reported a \$260,000 operating deficit for the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2021, extraordinary income more than offset the operating losses.

During 2021, extraordinary income consisted primarily of the forgiveness of the two Paycheck Protection Program (PPP) loans (totaling \$840,890) and market gains on parish and school investments (totaling \$106,099). However, extraordinary income is not a consistent source of income and cannot be counted on to offset future operating losses. With this in mind, MHR staff continues to closely monitors and where possible reduces expenditures.

Due to the ongoing effects of the Pandemic, we anticipate a continued strain on revenue streams in the next fiscal year. Looking ahead, we are in the process of obtaining bids to replace the school roof, a major expenditure expected in the 2022 fiscal year. We ask for your continued financial support of MHR through the offertory to maintain and fund our parish. We encourage you to review the report in the bulletin.
