

Confirmation Exam Study/Review Sheet

At our next session, you will be given an exam to assess how well you know the basics of your faith in preparation for Confirmation. As a result of this exam, your catechist and parents will know what they need to help you learn before Confirmation day. Here is an outline of what you should know:

<p>Know by heart (memorize) the 10 Commandments</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. I am the Lord your God: you shall not have strange gods before me.2. You shall not take the name of the Lord your God in vain.3. Remember to keep holy the Lord's Day.4. Honor your father and your mother.5. You shall not kill.6. You shall not commit adultery.7. You shall not steal.8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.	<p>Know by heart (memorize) the Seven Sacraments and their categories:</p> <p><u>Sacraments of Initiation</u> Baptism Confirmation Eucharist</p> <p><u>Sacraments of Healing</u> Penance/Reconciliation Anointing of the Sick</p> <p><u>Sacraments at the Service of Communion</u> Matrimony Holy Orders</p>
<p>Know how to describe/define the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• The Trinity• The Resurrection• The basic parts of the Mass (Introductory Rite, Liturgy of the Word, Liturgy of the Eucharist, Concluding Rite)• The Rosary• The Bible (Old Testament, New Testament, the 4 Gospels)• The Stations of the Cross• Prayer• Sin (mortal & venial)• The Nicene Creed• The Spiritual and Corporal Works of Mercy• The Virtues• The Seven Deadly Sins• The Paschal Mystery (suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus)• Mary's Assumption into heaven
