


Readings for April 9 2023

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

I was talking to some people recently about the state of affairs in our world these days. They were not happy. They saw Christian faith and values under attack. Evil was growing and spreading ever wider throughout the world. "This is spiritual warfare," one of them said. "There's a war between good and evil going on right now," another said. And in their minds, evil was winning.

"Maybe there is a war going on between good and evil," I replied, "but remember – the final victory has already been won." This made them pause a moment, and even smile a little. "You're right," they said, "the final victory has been won. But until then, we have to keep on fighting." I had to nod in agreement.

In a world that often seems to be a battleground between good and evil, especially today. In a world where evil often seems to win out, we need that good news of Easter. Christ has triumphed over sin and death in His resurrection from the dead. Sin and evil often seem to be winning, but Christ will win out in the end. He has already won the final victory in His death and resurrection.

That doesn't mean that we won't lose battles along the way. It doesn't mean that evil is going to disappear anytime soon. It doesn't mean that we don't have to fight against evil and try to resist temptations to sin. But it does mean that even though we may fail at times, the final victory will be our Lord's. Evil will not win out in the end. Christ will win. He already has.

Not only is the good news of Easter that Jesus has won the final victory. The good news is that we can share in that final victory. We have a share in our Lord's victory, we have a share in His life through our baptism. This is why we renew our baptismal promises on Easter Sunday. Through being faithful to the promises we made in baptism, we can come to share one day in the ultimate victory of the resurrection.

Whether you call it spiritual warfare or a battle between good and evil, that struggle can seem to be a constant one in our world today. Even though it may seem that evil is winning a great deal of the time, let's keep in mind that while battles may be lost along the way, the victory has already been won. The good news of Easter is that Christ has won the victory over sin and death. The even better news is that we can share in that victory through our baptism. We can share one day in the new life of the resurrection. Through Christ and in Christ, we can share in a new and better life even now. Happy Easter!

Next Sunday is Divine Mercy Sunday. There will be a Eucharistic Holy Hour starting at 3:00 PM. The Holy Hour will be preceded by the Sacrament of Reconciliation from 2:00 – 3:00 PM. A plenary indulgence can be obtained by those who do the following: sacramental confession within 20 days of Divine Mercy Sunday, receive Holy Communion, and pray for the intentions of the Pope. In addition, on Divine Mercy Sunday, in a church or chapel, in a spirit completely detached from the affection for any sin, the person seeking the indulgence is to take part in the prayers and devotions in honor of Divine Mercy, or in the presence of the Eucharist exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, in that same spirit of detachment from sin, to recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus, such as, "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you." A plenary indulgence removes all temporal punishment due to forgiven sin. Temporal punishment is the making up for sin to which sinners are obliged after they have been forgiven.

Just a reminder that the 9:30 AM Mass is part of the Sunday schedule again. We also have resumed the 6:30 AM weekday Mass, Monday through Friday

<u>Pro Labore Dei- Feed My Lambs is a non-profit Catholic organization</u> that is led by volunteers serving families and homeless individuals from sites in Robbins, Posen, Blue Island, in addition to some areas of Chicago. PLD Feed My Lambs began serving in Robbins in September 2004 by the leadership of a Nigerian Nun named Sister Stella Maris. PLD has served as a source of basic needs and hope for thousands in the South Cook County region.

Each Saturday volunteers distribute groceries for up to 130 families (6,670 bags). A consistent effort to make lunches for the individuals and families totals over 20,000 bagged lunches passed out annually.



PLD Feed My Lambs is an affiliate of Pro Labore Dei, an international organization feeding and clothing the homeless through locations across the globe. Sister Stella Maris founded the international organization based on callings from our Lord. Sister Stella has traveled the world, establishing affiliates where they are needed the most. On a regular basis, Sister Stella visits all PLD affiliates to support and share her calling. Currently Pro Labore Dei serves in 5 continents.


