

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR


After locking up the church following Masses last Sunday, as I walked back towards the altar, I noticed that there were fewer flowers than there had been a few weeks ago. A closer look revealed that all the lilies that had adorned the altar for Easter were no more. It made me think again that when it comes to decorating our churches, we have it backwards. The Christmas Season, which at its longest lasts just short of three weeks, has the poinsettia as its flower of choice. Poinsettias seem to last forever. Contrast that with the Easter Season. The Easter Season, which lasts a full seven weeks, has the Easter lily as its flower. Easter lilies have a very short shelf life. I sometimes think that things should be reversed. It would make more sense in a way for the poinsettia to be the Easter flower and the lily to be the Christmas flower. I know it would never catch on, but it does make some sense, at least to me.

The Easter Season will soon be going the way of the Easter lilies. This weekend, we celebrate the Ascension. Next weekend, we celebrate Pentecost, which brings the Easter Season to a close. While the Easter lilies and other flowers do not last, we should ask if anything of Easter lasts in us. Has the resurrection of our Lord made us more hopeful and optimistic? Has the renewal of our baptismal promises made us more conscious about living out our faith on a daily basis? Our Lord's death and resurrection brought forgiveness for our sins. Do we trust in that forgiveness and seek it for ourselves? Are we more willing to offer forgiveness to others? Do we see that we can change, that our lives can be new and different and better? Easter shows us the extent of our Lord's love. He died for us. He offers us a share in the resurrection. How willing are we to extend our Lord's love to the people around us? Is there anything of Easter that will last in us longer than the lilies or other Easter flowers do?

The Easter Season is coming to an end. We'll go back to wearing green vestments for Mass. We'll again use a penitential rite rather than a sprinkling rite at our Sunday Masses. The Paschal candle will move to a less prominent position. While a lot of things will revert to the way they were before Easter, I hope we will not go back to the way we were before Easter. I hope that something of Easter will remain with us and continue to make a difference in our lives.

Our annual Parish Carnival is less than a month away. This annual event returns this year to its pre-Covid Father's Day weekend dates. The Carnival Committee has been hard at work getting things organized for this year's event. The Carnival always brings the people of our parish and community together. It is also an important fundraiser for our parish. While the Carnival Committee has been hard at work, it takes more than a committee to make this event a success. Please be willing to volunteer some of your time to help make the Carnival a success once again. Please contact the rectory if you would like to volunteer.




