A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

If you shop for greeting cards with any regularity, you know that some cards, such as birthday cards, anniversary cards, or get-well cards, are always available. Other cards tend to be more seasonal. Among the seasonal cards, Mothers' Day cards have now been replaced by Fathers' Day cards and graduation cards.

I was looking at some graduation cards recently. One showed a penguin flapping its wings and trying to fly, which we know penguins do not do. The card read on the front, "You Graduated!" On the inside it said, "I Guess Anything's Possible!" Another showed a graduate walking across the stage to receive his diploma from the principal. He holds his hand out and the principal says, "Oh, you want your diploma? Sorry, the dog ate it. Not so funny **now**, is it?" The student must have used that excuse a few times too often. The front of a third card showed two professors looking at a globe. One of them says, "Iceland would be good." The other says, "Yeah, I guess the North Pole would be too much to hope for." The inside of the card reads, "Your teachers are hoping you'll go far, Grad." As we celebrate graduation for so many of our parishioners, it is that third card that gives us something to think about.

It is the hope of their teachers that graduates will go far, not far away never to be seen again, but that they will go far in terms of being successful. Whether it's success in a career or success at the next level of education, teachers, parents, and others who have had a role in a student's education hope that student will be successful. That success can be measured in many ways. It could be academic honors won or scholarships received. It could be rising to one of the top positions in a business, or maybe owning your own business. It could be how much you earn or rising to a level of prominence in a field such as law or medicine. It could be to somehow make a difference in the world for the better. There are many measures of success.

While those are all certainly legitimate measures of success, for Catholic graduates, whether they are graduates of Catholic schools or are graduates who happen to be Catholics, there is another measure of success. That measure of success is how well we live out our faith. Do we carry on our Lord's work in the world? Do we live by the values of the gospel in our lives? Do we care for the least of our brothers and sisters? Are we willing to forgive others, no matter how many times or how great the offense <u>done</u> to us? Do we share generously with those who are in need? Do we perform the works of mercy? We may not become millionaires or rise to the top of our profession, but if we live out our faith in these and other ways, we will go far and be successful in the way that should matter to us the most.

Congratulations to all the graduates from our parish! We hope that you will go far and be successful in the future. As Catholic graduates, we hope you will be successful and go far in the way that is most important to us as believers in our Lord. May you follow our Lord and live out your Catholic faith. If you do that, you will go far and be successful. You will also make a difference for the better in our world.


