A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

I recently read an article about Andrea Jaeger. If you are a tennis fan, her name should be familiar. Andrea Jaeger was born in Chicago in 1965. She grew up in the north suburbs of Skokie and Lincolnshire. She started playing tennis and became good enough to turn professional at the age of 14. She had great success as a professional. She rose to become the #2 ranked woman professional in the world. She reached the finals of Wimbledon and the French Open. She made millions of dollars. She had the life and the success that most of us dream about. At the age of 19, she left her tennis career. A major shoulder injury was part of the reason she left. The abuse she suffered within the professional tennis community was another reason. She also realized that she lacked the commitment needed to be the #1 player.

Andrea Jaeger did not grow up in a religious home. Her parents did not attend church, and there wasn't a Bible in their home. Despite this, Andrea Jaeger says she always believed in God. No one in her family knew that she prayed every day. She knew that God was her friend, and she had a personal relationship with Him. While she was still playing tennis, Andrea started visiting hospitals during tournaments. This awakened in her a deep desire to help others, which she found hard to reconcile with the narrow-minded focus of a top tennis player. Andrea used her tennis winnings to create the Silver Lining Foundation. The Foundation's purpose was to provide long-term care to children with cancer and children in need. Her faith and desire to serve God led her to become an Anglican Dominican nun in 2006. She is still a nun today.

For someone to give up the career of a professional athlete and the money and fame that goes along with it to enter religious life may be shocking to us. What I found interesting is what Andrea Jaeger said about the life God has called her to. She said, "I have a joy and love of life and it's easier to express that in this field." Andrea Jaeger finds joy in giving her life to our Lord and serving Him in the people she ministers to. I imagine what she feels is similar to what St. Francis of Assisi felt after giving away all he had and leaving a life of wealth and luxury behind to give his life to our Lord. Francis found such great joy in doing this that he attracted others to join him in his new way of life.

I read something recently suggesting that so many people leave the Church not because of disagreement over teachings or scandals in the Church. They leave because they don't find joy in the Church. Pope Francis has written about the joy of the gospel. Andrea Jaeger finds joy as she serves God as a nun. St. Francis of Assisi found joy in giving his life completely to Christ, taking the gospel at its word and following it fully. Do we ever find this same kind of joy in following our Lord?

Matthew Kelly is a well-known Catholic writer and speaker. I once heard him give a talk. He said that when he finds a teaching of the Church that he disagrees with or finds hard to accept, he doesn't just disregard it. Instead, he asks, "What am I missing? What am I doing wrong? What am I not understanding about this teaching?" This leads him to greater knowledge and understanding, and ultimately acceptance. Our Lord wants us to have joy in following Him. As He said, "He came that we might have life in all its fullness." If we are not finding the joy in our faith that Sr. Andrea finds, or St. Francis found, we might want to borrow from Matthew Kelly and ask, "What are we missing? What are we doing wrong? What are we not understanding about our faith that will bring us the joy that others have found in following Christ?




