A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

"Mary, Queen of Victory.....pray for us!!!" If you were ever huddled together with your teammates saying a pre-game prayer, you may have ended it with those words. The title, "Mary, Queen of Victory," or, "Our Lady of Victory," has an interesting story behind it.

In 1571, Moslem Turks were threatening to overrun Europe. They were turned back when their naval fleet was defeated by Christian forces at the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. Pope Pius V had asked that Mary's intercession and aid be invoked against the Turks through the praying of the Rosary. Pius V attributed the Christian victory to Mary's help. This led to Mary receiving the title "Our Lady of Victory," and to October 7 being named the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary.

October is the month of the Rosary. We are encouraged to honor Mary through the praying of the Rosary. While we can pray the Rosary at any time, we are especially encouraged to do so during October. Praying the Rosary is one very special way we have of honoring Mary and invoking her help and aid. The repeated prayers of the Rosary make it a meditative prayer. As we meditate on the mysteries, we are reminded of what God has done for us in the past. Remembering what God has done for us in the past can help us recognize what God is doing for us today and give us confidence that God is faithful and will continue to be there to help us and act on our behalf in the future.

There are people who pray the Rosary in church after Mass. But we don't have to be in a church to pray the Rosary. We can pray the Rosary while we're driving in our car. We can pray the Rosary privately in our room at home, or together as a family. We can pray the Rosary while we are doing laundry, or getting dinner ready, or taking a walk, or exercising on a treadmill or bicycle. We don't even need a Rosary to pray the Rosary. We can always use our fingers to count the Hail Mary's if we don't have a Rosary with us.

During this month dedicated to Mary through the praying of the Rosary, I hope we will find time to honor Mary in this way. Let's also try to pray the Rosary throughout the year, and not just during October.




