MISSION STATEMENT

We, the family of Most Holy Redeemer Parish, commit ourselves to enriching our relationship with God by following the teachings of Jesus Christ. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Blessed Pauline Jaricot was born in France in 1799 to a profoundly religious aristocratic family. Pauline was wealthy, carefree, and good-natured. She became interested in the work of the missions and in 1822, she called a group of young women together to pray for the missionaries in foreign lands and to support them by giving a penny a week. This group of young women would grow into the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. The Society for the Propagation of the Faith would help to fund the construction of many churches here in the United States. The United States was considered a mission territory until 1908. Pauline Jaricot would die penniless in 1862, her wealth and life having been spent to ensure that the gospel message would be carried to the ends of the earth.

This weekend, we celebrate World Mission Sunday. This weekend, we have the opportunity to support the Society for the Propagation of the Faith, the mission society founded by Blessed Pauline Jaricot. We are asked to support the work of the missions in the same way that the group of young women first brought together by Pauline Jaricot did – through prayer and financial support. I hope we will pray for those who work in the foreign missions and be generous in our financial support in the Mission Sunday collection this weekend.

World Mission Sunday is not only is an opportunity to help the missions by supporting the Society for the Propagation of the Faith. It is also an opportunity for us to reflect upon the missionary nature of the Church. Christ sent His Apostles out to baptize all nations. They were to bring the gospel message to all the world. That work of bringing the gospel message to all the world is now in our hands.

The missionary nature of the Church is not something we think about very often. After all, we are staying here. We are not headed for foreign lands to preach the gospel. But we are still called to be missionaries. There are many people right here at home who need to hear the gospel message. They may be people who have grown up without faith being a part of their lives. They may be people who have left the practice of their faith. They may be people in our families, or friends and neighbors, or people we work with. We have to be the missionaries who bring the message of the gospel to them. The missionary nature of the Church and our call to evangelize others will be something we hear a lot more about as we move forward in the *Renew My Church* initiative. Let's pray for those who work in the foreign missions. Let's give them our generous financial support. Let's also start to think more seriously about the missionary nature of the Church and our own call to be missionaries. How can we bring the gospel message to those who need to hear it?

There is an article in the bulletin this weekend outlining the various liturgical ministries in our parish. All these ministries are in need of more people to take part in them. Please take the time to read about these ministries. There is contact information listed in case you have questions or want more information about any of these ministries. Representatives will also be available after Masses this weekend in case you want to talk to someone about a particular ministry. Next weekend, there will be commitment forms that you can fill out and return at Mass if you wish to be part of one of these liturgical ministries. Please take some time this coming week to reflect and pray about whether you are called to participate in one of these ministries.

Asylum seekers — men, women and children — are arriving in Chicago. Will you welcome the stranger? We are the body of Christ alive in this world. The stranger is hungry and thirsting — Christ is presenting himself to us in their need. We are called to respond with faith and love.

Thousands of people are fleeing violence, political oppression, and overwhelming poverty in Central and South American countries. Since early September, parishes, priests, religious sisters and brothers, church ministries, and Catholic Charities have shown an outpouring of concern for these travelers.

These brothers and sisters in need have revealed to us the fragility, strength, and sacredness of our shared humanity. In turn, they are experiencing the love of Christ through the compassion of volunteers and employees.

Over 3,000 asylum seekers arrived in Chicago by mid-October, and **a coordinated Catholic response is underway** so we can maximize our collective impact. We are providing pastoral care and considering options such as transitional shelter and parish-family sponsorship opportunities.

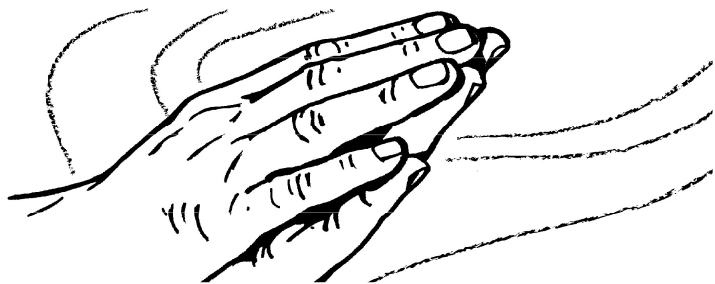
