A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Even though he loses his spot on the liturgical calendar this year to the 5th Sunday of Lent, March 17 is still culturally St. Patrick's Day. On Tuesday, March 19, we will celebrate the feast of St. Joseph. While there is certainly an ethnic and cultural dimension to our celebration on these days, we should not forget that the men we honor are **saints**. More than any ethnic or cultural contributions, these men are saints whom we honor for their faith and their religious contributions.

St. Patrick did not originate corned beef. He did not bring soda bread to Ireland. He did not popularize the wearing of green. He is not really responsible for any of the things we do to celebrate his feast day which has become a blur of all things Irish. It's not that we shouldn't enjoy the parades and the music and the dancing and the soda bread and corned beef and everything else. What we shouldn't forget though, is what St. Patrick **did** bring to the people of Ireland. He brought them the Catholic faith. Despite the opposition and hardships he encountered, St. Patrick persevered in his missionary work. His efforts bore great fruit as the people of Ireland embraced the Catholic faith. In a short time, Ireland was sending out priests to carry on the missionary work of St. Patrick. Priests from Ireland re-evangelized Europe following the fall of the Roman Empire. Missionaries from Ireland have continued to bring the Catholic faith around the world. The Catholic faith has always played an important role in the life of the Irish people. As we celebrate St. Patrick and all things Irish this weekend, let's make sure we don't forget St. Patrick's real contribution of bringing the Catholic faith to the people of Ireland.

St. Joseph was the husband of Mary, the mother of Jesus. We honor him on his feast day by wearing red and maybe taking part in a St. Joseph's Table. If we have that particular skill set, we may even want to engage in a little woodworking since St. Joseph was a carpenter. I always feel a little sorry for St. Joseph. I feel he is the overlooked member of the Holy Family. Mary has at least 16 feast days on the liturgical calendar. St. Joseph has 2. It's not that we shouldn't honor Mary for her faith and willingness to say, "Yes," to whatever God asked of her. But we should honor St. Joseph also for his faith and willingness to do whatever God asked of Him. Joseph said, "Yes," to God just as Mary did. Whether it was taking Mary into his home as his wife in the face of her mysterious pregnancy or getting up in the middle of the night to flee to Egypt for safety with his young family, Joseph always said, "Yes," to whatever God asked of him. And he did it without the benefit of an immaculate conception, which might make him an even better model for us to imitate. We should keep in mind the faith of St. Joseph and his role in protecting and caring for Jesus and Mary as we celebrate his feast day.

I hope we will all enjoy the ethnic and cultural aspects of the celebration of these two great saints. Let's keep in mind though, that they are **saints**. What makes them important is their faith and their religious contributions. That's why we honor them. Maybe we can try to support some missionary activity if not engage in it ourselves to honor St. Patrick. Maybe we can try to say, "Yes," to something God may be asking of us to honor St. Joseph.

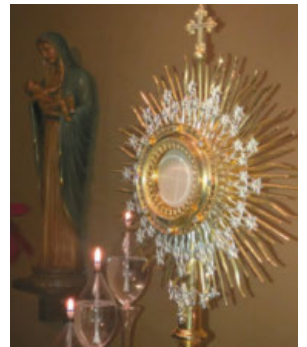

OUR DROP OF WATER TO EASE BURNING IMMIGRATION ISSUES IN CHICAGO

In October 2022, Mercy Sisters Pat Murphy and JoAnn Persch were asked by the Sanctuary Working Group to help an asylum-seeking mother and five children from Sierra Leone. They brought the need to the Chicago Mercy Justice Committee of sisters and associates who agreed to find funds, housing, and all else the family would need. They didn't realize that they were on the road to starting a non-profit, but they were.

Visions of the buses, tents, overflowing police stations and shelters impelled a small group to accept and help other asylum-seeking families, and Catherine's Caring Cause, named for Sisters of Mercy foundress Catherine McAuley, was founded. By the end of 2023, it was Catherine's Caring Cause, Inc NFP. Since its inception, CCC has situated nine families in eight furnished homes on Chicago's southside. Each home has a mentor who helps with everything from enrolling kids in school to helping with medical and legal issues to explaining how washing machines work (Google Translate is a God-send for Venezuelan families) and everything in between. We are currently helping 13 adults and 23 children and are searching for two more homes.

We need YOUR help as we struggle to raise funds to pay rent, utilities, legal and medical fees. We also need mentors and others to help with such things as driving and teaching English.

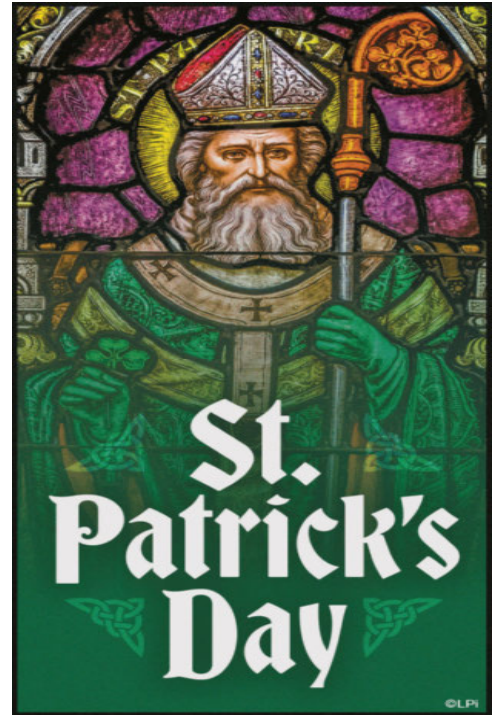
