## **A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

“What is wrong with people today? Why do they think they can do things like that?” That was something I heard this past week talking to someone about what happened to Nick Baracco last weekend. Why do people think they can do things like that? What is wrong with them?

I hear people ask that more and more about the events that take place around us each day. Why do people think they can assault someone who is just walking down the street? Why Do people feel they can shoot a gun into a crowd? Why do people think they can carjack someone? Why do they think they can do anything they want with no concern for who gets hurt or adversely affected by what they choose to do? For me, the answer is a simple one. As we remove God more and more from public life, we should not be surprised that these things happen more and more frequently. That is something for us to think about as we celebrate Independence Day this coming week.

The document whose signing we celebrate on July 4, the Declaration of Independence, makes mention of “the Laws of Nature’s God.” It speaks of a Creator who endows us with inalienable rights such as life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. It mentions a reliance on Divine Providence. While much has been made about just how religious the signers of the Declaration of Independence actually were, it’s pretty obvious they did not want to cut God out of the picture entirely as we seem to want to do today.

The establishment clause of the First Amendment to the Constitution is often quoted as the basis for the so-called separation of Church and state. The establishment clause forbids the establishment of a religion. We have to understand that many of the early settlers of our country came here for religious freedom. They came from countries where everyone had to be a Lutheran, or an Anglican, or a Calvinist, or whatever religion the king or queen happened to espouse. What the establishment clause means is that there is no religion in the United States that everyone must belong to. The government cannot favor one religion over other religions. The free exercise of religion is not to be interfered with. While there is to be no establishment of a state religion, the establishment clause does not mean that religion and religious values should have no place in public life as so many today believe.

When I was in college, I took a political science course. The text we used was “Democracy in America” by Alexis de Tocqueville. He was a Frenchman who came here in the 1800s to study our country. There were many things about our form of government that impressed him. One thing he wrote that made an impression on me was his observation that for our form of government to work and for our nation’s success, we need to be religious people. Without God and religion, our form of government will not work. Religion must have an influence on public life.

All of this would indicate that God and religion are not meant to be excluded from public life. If our rights have come from God, shouldn’t we exercise them as God would want us to? To do otherwise is a misuse of those rights. While no state religion is to exist in the United States, it doesn’t mean that religion and religious values have no place in public life. They do, and they are needed. As de Tocqueville points out, without God and religion, our form of government doesn’t work.

Maybe one last point to reflect on are the words of the Russian author Dostoevsky. He wrote, “If there is no God, everything is permitted.” If there is no God as the ultimate authority, what prevents us from doing whatever we feel like? Maybe that is what is wrong with people today Maybe that’s why they think they can get away with the things they do. The more we move God out of the picture, the more permissible the impermissible becomes. Our founding fathers did not remove God from the picture. Neither should we. Something to think about as we celebrate our independence as a nation and the freedom we enjoy.
