We, the family of Most Holy Redeemer Parish, commit ourselves to enriching our relationship with God by following the teachings of Jesus Christ. A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Thursday, August 15, is the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. At the end of her life on earth, Mary did not die as we do. At the end of her life on earth, Mary was assumed, or taken up into heaven, both body and soul. The Assumption is the direct result of the Immaculate Conception. If Mary was preserved from original sin by God's special gift from the very moment of her conception, then Mary would not have to suffer death as we will, death being one of the consequences of original sin. The Assumption is a holy day of obligation. Masses on Thursday will be at 6:30 and 8:30 AM, and at 7:30 PM.

While belief in the Assumption had been widespread in the Church for centuries, it wasn't until 1950 that the Assumption was defined as a dogma of the faith by Pope Pius XII. In defining the Assumption as a dogma of the faith, the Pope spoke infallibly. This was actually the last time the Pope spoke infallibly on a matter of faith and morals. This is something that is often misunderstood. Papal infallibility means that the Pope will not make an error when speaking in a definitive way about a matter of faith or morals. It only applies under very specific circumstances. The Pope must be speaking about a matter of faith or morals. If he is talking about his favorite sports team, he is not infallible. He must be speaking in a definitive way, to clarify or settle the matter of faith or morals for the whole Church. Finally, he must be speaking as the head of the Church to all the faithful, and not just giving his opinion about something in an interview. It is only under these conditions that the Pope speaks infallibly. This doesn't mean that we can ignore what the Pope says unless he is speaking infallibly. We are to still listen to what the Pope says and try to follow it. Not everything the Pope says is infallible though. He does not speak infallibly in this way very often, the last time being in defining the Assumption as a dogma of the faith in 1950.

After many years of teaching in our school, Nancy Cagney retired from teaching at the end of the past school year. While she retired from teaching, she wasn't ready to retire completely. She applied for our vacant Religious Education Director position. An interview team spoke to all the candidates for the position, they felt that Miss Cagney would be the best candidate. I offered her the position and she accepted. We welcome her to this new position. She brings many years of experience teaching religion which will make her a valuable resource for our religious education catechists. She also has a great desire to pass on the Catholic faith to the next generation. We welcome Miss Cagney to this new role and ask our Lord to bless her as she begins.

It seems like summer vacation just started. It doesn't seem possible that a new school year is just around the corner, but it is. (BOO!!!) Next Sunday, August 18, we will have our Backpack Blessing at the 9:30 AM Mass. All children are invited to bring their backpacks to the 9:30 Mass for a special blessing for their backpacks and for them as they begin a new school year

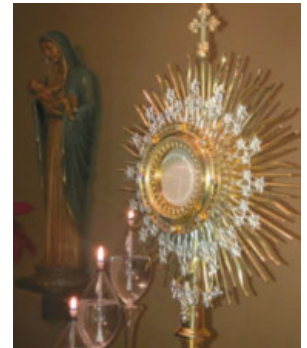
