A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

“Who made us?” “God made us.” “Why did God make us?” “God made us to know, love, and serve Him in this life, and to be happy with Him forever in the next.” If you are an older Catholic, you may recognize these as some of the first questions and answers in *The Baltimore Catechism* (depending on which edition you have). *The Baltimore Catechism* was widely used for the religious education of children for many years. It presented the Catholic faith in a simple question and answer format. *The Baltimore Catechism* was part of my grade school religion classes through fifth grade.

One thing I liked about *The Baltimore Catechism* was that it presented the Catholic faith in a way that was easy to follow. Even more, it gave answers to the questions you may have had. Maybe you didn't completely understand the answer or agree with it, but *The Baltimore Catechism* didn't leave you hanging. There is something else I like about it today. It is found in those first few questions and answers in the catechism. It tells us that our lives have a purpose. That purpose is not to get good jobs and make lots of money, or be successful in our careers, or live in nice houses and drive fancy cars. Our purpose is “to know, love, and serve God in this life, and to be happy with Him forever in the next.”

That is something to think about as another school year is just around the corner. Catholic education, whether in a Catholic school or in a religious education program, has the goal of helping us to know God. That is the main goal. Catholic education more than anything else should help us to know God. Not know about God. Know God. We can learn many things about God. We can learn that God loves us and cares about us. We can learn that God is merciful and forgiving. We can learn about commandments, prayers, and sacraments. But learning that God loves us and cares about us is not the same as actually knowing God's love and care because we have experienced it. Learning that God is merciful and forgiving is not the same as actually knowing God is merciful and forgiving because we have felt that mercy and forgiveness in our lives. While Catholic education certainly helps to know about God and our faith, what it really strives to do is to help us know God. It strives to give us experiences that will help us to know God. It is easier to love God and serve Him once we know Him. The teachings of our faith also make a lot more sense when we know God.

Knowing God is not just something for our school days. Even as adults, we should strive to know God better. As a new school year begins, I hope it will be a year in which the students in our school and in our religious education program come to know God, or to know Him better. Even if our school days are way behind us, we still have the purpose in our lives of knowing God better. I hope we will all look for ways we can do that in the year that lies ahead.

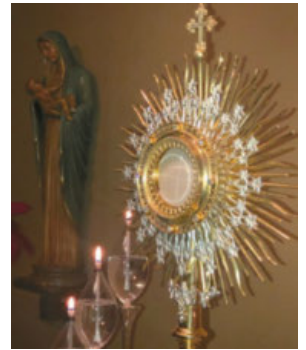

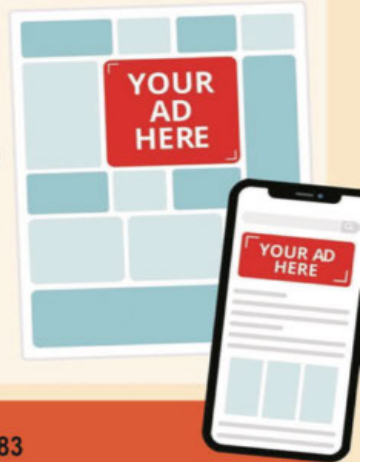
