A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

I don't know if the customs have changed, but it used to be that in Europe it was frowned upon for men to wear shorts unless they were at the beach or engaged in some athletic activity. I found this out the hard way.

About thirty years ago, I was on a trip to Europe. One of the places we visited was Monte Carlo in Monaco. It was a very warm day, and I was wearing shorts. I had wandered into the lobby of the Grand Hotel and was looking around. A very official looking man came up to me and asked, "Are you staying with us, sir?" "No," I said, "I'm just looking around." "Then look from over there," he said, and pointed to a section of the lobby that was roped off and out of the way. I found out that how you were dressed made a big difference in Monte Carlo. At the casino, you were allowed to play blackjack and other card games as well as craps and roulette only if you were wearing a suit, or better yet, a tuxedo. If not, you could only play slot machines, and they were in a completely separate section of the casino. There went my James Bond fantasy of playing baccarat in Monte Carlo. It didn't matter if you were a multi-billionaire. If you didn't have a suit on, you couldn't play.

I found my experience in Monte Carlo to be a good illustration of what St. Paul writes this weekend. "If a man with gold rings and fine clothes comes into your assembly, and a poor person in shabby clothes also comes in, and you pay attention to the one wearing fine clothes and say, 'Sit here, please,' while you say to the poor one, 'Stand there,' or, 'Sit at my feet,' have you not made distinctions among yourselves and become judges with evil designs?" (Sounds like St. Paul may have visited Monte Carlo.)

We often tend to judge by appearances. It's not that a first impression doesn't matter, and how we are dressed certainly says something about the importance we attach to an event, but we can't limit ourselves to that. We have to be willing to go beyond a person's appearance or the first impression someone made to find out what that person is really like. Someone who makes a great first impression or who has a wonderful appearance may not be all he or she is cracked up to be once we get below the surface. St. Paul goes on to write that those who are poor in the world are rich in faith and heirs of the kingdom God promised to those who love Him. God looks beyond appearances to see the true person. Let's try to make sure that we also look beyond appearances and first impressions to find out who people really are before we make any judgments about them.

Next Saturday is the National Day of Remembrance for Aborted Children. A prayer service will take place at 10:30 AM at St. Mary Cemetery at the burial site of 500 aborted children. There will be signs directing you to the site of the prayer service. Please join us if you can to pray that all human life will one day be respected and have legal protection from the moment of conception to the moment when life naturally comes to an end.
