

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

You often find interesting things when you are looking for something else. That happened to me recently. I was looking on my desk for an invoice from the doctor. Instead, I found a small pamphlet. The front of the pamphlet contained some words from St. Augustine: "You aspire to great things? Begin with little ones."

St. Augustine's words would certainly echo our Lord's words that if you can trust someone in small matters, you can also trust that person in greater matters. Little things meant a lot to Jesus. He cured a woman who just touched His cloak. He pointed out that a woman who put two small coins into the temple treasury gave more than those who put in much larger amounts because she gave all she had.

That idea of beginning with little things applies to many areas of life. A baby doesn't just get up and start running. The baby has to crawl first, then walk, then run. No one starts doing calculus without learning all the mathematical skills that come before that. You have to learn to throw and catch and hit before you can start playing baseball.

This is certainly true when it comes to our faith. We start out with small things and build our way up to doing greater things. If we want to do great things for God, we begin with small matters like praying each day. We take the small step of making Sunday Mass and the sacraments a part of our lives. We try to live our faith out in small matters of honesty and generosity and forgiveness. Doing these small things creates a foundation in our lives from which it will be a little easier to fulfill the greater demands our faith will place upon us.

I don't know how many people I have met who feel they can neglect these smaller matters of the faith and then think they will come through for our Lord when it comes to the greater and more difficult demands of our faith. It doesn't work that way. Following our Lord and being faithful in greater matters comes when we have been faithful in smaller matters and built up that foundation in our lives.

If we seek to serve God in larger matters and do great things where our faith is concerned, let's remember what St. Augustine says because he is certainly right. If we aspire to greater things, we have to begin with little ones. Let's try to do that where our faith is concerned. Let's start with following our Lord in some small ways so we can build up to following our Lord in much greater ways.


MHR St Vincent DePaul's mission is to assist people living in MHR Parish boundaries in times of need.

MHR FOLK GROUP


Like to sing? Play an instrument? Want to be more involved in your Parish and share your faith?


Come and join us and be a part of something good!
