MISSION STATEMENT

We, the family of Most Holy Redeemer Parish, commit ourselves to enriching our relationship with God by following the teachings of Jesus Christ. With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

In 1571, Moslem Turks were threatening to overrun Europe. The Turkish advance into Europe was halted at the Battle of Lepanto on October 7, 1571. An overwhelming Turkish naval force was defeated by a much smaller Christian force. The Christian victory was attributed to the intercession of the Blessed Mother whose help had been invoked by the praying of the Rosary. Pope Pius V prayed the Rosary while the battle was raging. The Christian forces prayed the Rosary throughout the night before the battle. Many others prayed the Rosary at the request of the Pope.

The victory at the Battle of Lepanto led to October 7 being celebrated as the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary. It also led to Mary being given the title, "Our Lady of Victory." If you were ever on a team that concluded a pre-game prayer or ended a timeout by saying, "Our Lady of Victory....Pray for us," or, "Mary, Queen of Victory....Pray for us," this is where it comes from. The victory at the Battle of Lepanto also led to the association of the month of October with the Rosary.

October is the month of the Rosary. While the Rosary is a prayer we can pray at any time, we are especially encouraged to do so during October. We read in the Scriptures of Mary keeping things in her heart and reflecting on them. Praying the Rosary gives us the opportunity to do the same thing. As we pray the Rosary and reflect on the different mysteries, we are reminded of what God has done in us and for us through His Son, Jesus.

The Rosary is a prayer we can pray anywhere. If you don't think you have time to pray the Rosary, you probably do. You can pray the Rosary while you drive. It's a lot safer than talking on the phone or texting. You can pray the Rosary while you're walking or jogging. It might be a little awkward to hold a Rosary while you're running, but you can always use your fingers. You can pray the Rosary while you're doing work around the house. There are many opportunities to incorporate the Rosary into our daily routines. Let's try to take advantage of them, especially during the month of the Rosary.

We find ourselves in need of additional lectors and Eucharistic Ministers. If you feel our Lord is calling you to serve Him in one of these ministries, please contact me at the rectory. The schedule rotates so you would not have to serve at Mass every weekend. We need additional lectors. We like our lectors to serve with a partner, and a number of our lectors are currently without one. If we are going to offer communion under both species at all our weekend Masses, we are going to need some more Eucharistic Ministers. Please think about and pray about whether our Lord is calling you to serve Him and the people of our parish in one of these ministries. If you feel God is calling you, give me a call (708-425-5354 ext. 209) so training can be arranged for you.

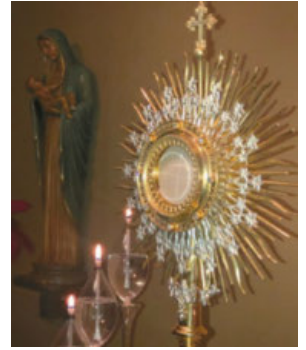

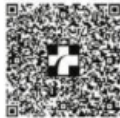
