With the guidance of the Holy Spirit, we continue to build the Kingdom of God in our midst. Our vision is to foster the faith of all through prayer, service, education, and ministry.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

When I was growing up, if you had a jack o' lantern on your front steps for Halloween, it was the height of Halloween decorating. If you added a couple of cornstalks, your Halloween house was in a class by itself. Today, Halloween decorations have gone way beyond cornstalks and jack o' lanterns. When it comes to decorating your house for a holiday today, only Christmas beats out Halloween.

While it can be fun to decorate our houses for Halloween, Halloween has never been a big day in the Church. Halloween's significance is that it points to the two great feasts that come after it: All Saints Day on November 1 and All Souls Day on November 2. All Saints Day at one time was known as All Hallow's Day. The day before was known as All Hallow's Evening which was shortened to Halloween.

All Saints Day and All Souls Day remind us that the Church, the Family of God, is not just limited to the members of the Church here on earth. We are united with the other members of the Church here on earth through our baptism. But the Family of God is larger than that. It also includes the saints in heaven and the souls in purgatory. We are united with them too. This larger Church, this larger Family of God we belong to, is called the Communion of Saints.

Just as we have duties and obligations towards one another in our own families, we also have duties and obligations towards one another as members of the Communion of Saints. Here on earth, we worship together, we pray with and for one another, we help one another and care for one another, and work together to carry on our Lord's work.

We are united also with the saints in heaven. The saints we honor on All Saints Day are not so much the famous saints. The saints we honor on All Saints Day are all who have reached heaven and are now considered saints. They are people just like us. They may even be people we know. The fact that we honor them on All Saints Day reminds us that God wants all of us to one day be in heaven and be saints ourselves. The fact that they are people just like us lets us know that it is possible for us to one day be saints. We have the duty of honoring the saints by trying to follow their example and asking them in prayer to intercede for us. The saints pray for us. They intercede on our behalf and help us.

Finally, the Communion of Saints includes the souls in purgatory. The souls in purgatory whom we remember on All Souls Day are awaiting their entry into heaven. The good thing is that they one day will be in heaven. The bad thing is they can no longer do anything to respond to God's love and help themselves get to heaven. As members of the Communion of Saints, we have the duty to remember the souls in purgatory. The prayers we say for them and the good works we offer for them can help them get to heaven. Then, when they are saints, they will pray for us and intercede on our behalf and help us.

While we especially remember the souls in purgatory and all the faithful departed on All Souls Day, we can certainly remember them in prayer and offer our good works for them at other times. One way in which we can remember our departed loved ones throughout the year is to use our All Souls Day envelope to enroll them in the Purgatorial Society. Mass is offered for the members of the Purgatorial Society at the Masses on All Souls Day, and at 6:30 AM on every Monday throughout the year. I hope we will remember that praying for our departed loved ones and offering up good works for them is the best way to remember them. I always shake my head when I see makeshift shrines erected where someone died in an accident or outside the home of someone who just passed away. While it may be a nice thing to do, the makeshift shrine won't help that person get to heaven. The prayers and good works we offer for that person will. Let's make sure we remember our deceased loved ones with our prayers and good works.

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR CONT.

Fr. Joe Hardy, who served our parish in retirement for many years, passed away in Canada this past summer. His funeral and burial took place in Canada. We do not want to forget Fr. Hardy and all that he did for the people of Most Holy Redeemer. We will remember him at a Memorial Mass on Tuesday, October 29, at 7:00 PM. All are welcome to attend. Please try to join us.
