A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

One of the great privileges we have as citizens of the United States is the right to vote. We are very fortunate to have that right which enables us to choose who the leaders of our government will be. That is something that not all people around the world are able to do. We are very fortunate in this country. Because we are fortunate enough to have the right to vote, we should make sure we use that right. It's an important part of being good citizens.

Not only should we exercise our right to vote, but it is also important that we exercise that right wisely. We need to be informed voters. Especially in an election as contentious as the current one, we need to be informed. The old adage, "Don't believe everything you hear, and only half of what you see," would be good to keep in mind. While we don't have to be quite as skeptical as the adage implies, it is still good to find out for ourselves whether or not we should believe what we are hearing from various candidates. We should try to find out where candidates stand on the various issues that are important to us. Instead of just looking at personalities, we should look at what policies a candidate is promising to enact. Getting as much information as we can will help us cast our votes wisely.

I hope too that we will be informed **Catholic** voters. While the Church is not allowed to endorse candidates, we can certainly urge people to consider issues when they vote. I hope we will consider issues that are important to us as Catholics when we are deciding who to vote for. I hope we will consider issues such as the right to life, school choice, parental rights, support for traditional marriage and family, and other issues that should be of concern to us as Catholics when casting our votes.

I know that many people have already voted. If you haven't, I hope you will exercise this great privilege we have as Americans this coming Tuesday. If you don't vote, you have no right to complain later on. I hope we will all vote in this very important election. Most of all, I hope we will vote wisely. Let's make sure we try to inform ourselves as much as possible about where a candidate stands on the issues, especially the issues that should be important to us as Catholics.

Good luck to our 7th-8th grade football team. Our varsity Raiders will try to complete a perfect 10-0 season as they play St. Michael for the gold ball championship at Marist High School at 3:00 PM on Sunday afternoon. If Most Holy Redeemer wins, it would be the 4th championship in a row that our 7th-8th grade teams have won. Our 5th-6th grade Raiders were not so lucky. They were eliminated in the semi-finals last weekend by St. John Fisher. They still had a very successful 6-3 season. Congratulations to all our players and coaches on their success this year. Go Raiders!

DON'T FORGET TO DO THIS BY DECEMBER 1ST.

If you have an individual retirement account and you are age 73 or older, you probably know that you must take your required minimum distribution (RMD) before the year ends.

However, did you know that you can fulfill all or part of your RMD and reduce your taxable income by transferring funds directly from your IRA to your parish or the Archdiocese of Chicago?

Be sure to request the transfer before December 1st to give your IRA custodian enough time to complete your charitable distribution before the year ends. The timing is important.
