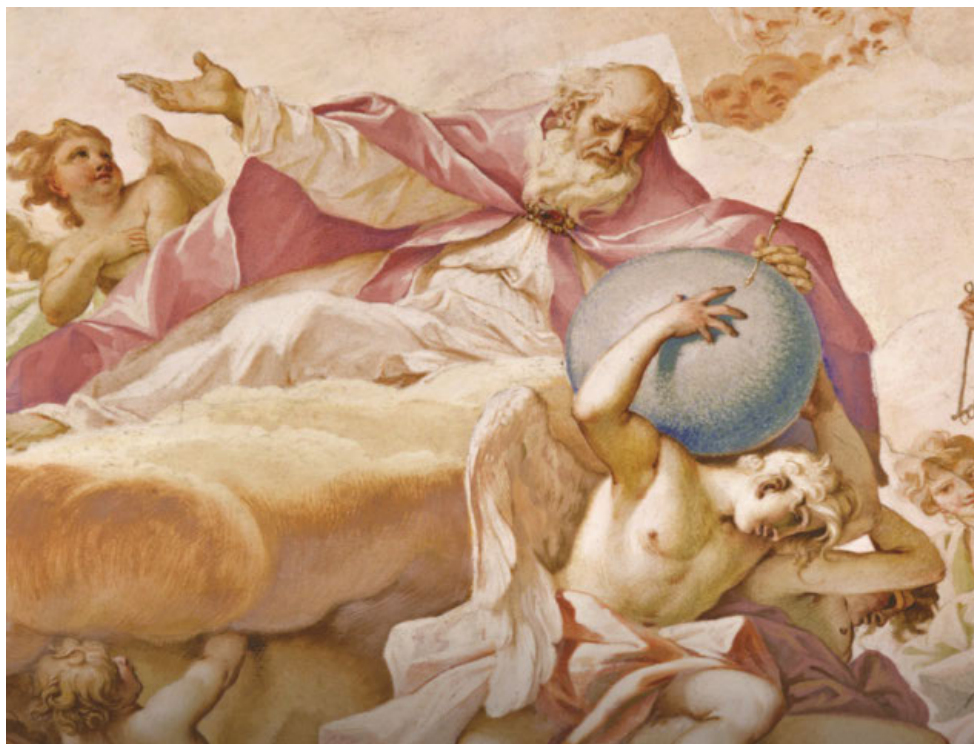

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

Predictions about when the world will end have been around almost as the world has been around. When I was a senior in high school, the parents of one of my friends switched religions. They changed from being Catholics to being Jehovah's Witnesses. Every day in homeroom, my classmate would tell us about his parents and their new religious beliefs. One of their beliefs was that the world was going to end on October 30, 1972. They had seen the signs spoken of in the Scriptures and had calculated that October 30, 1972, was going to be the end. Every day, we got the "end of the world update." Obviously, the world did not end on October 30, 1972. My friend's parents said the Jehovah's Witnesses had miscalculated.

In more recent years, you might remember that as the year 2000 approached, there were many predictions that some disaster would strike as all the computers went haywire and that would be the end. You may remember the Mayan calendar that predicted the end of the world on December 21, 2012. I had considered doing all my Christmas shopping that year with my credit card. If the Mayans were right, the world would end before my payment was due and I wouldn't have to pay for any Christmas gifts. Even though Jesus tells us in the gospel this weekend that no one knows the hour or the day when the world will end, that doesn't stop people from trying to predict when the end will take place.

If we stop and think about it, the signs that the Scriptures tell us will announce that the end is coming – the wars, famines, floods, earthquakes, and other natural disasters have always been with us. They let us know that the end could come at any time. Since these signs have always been with us, they also seem to say that unless we blow ourselves up, the world will probably be around for a good while longer.

Not only have people tried to predict the end of the world. People have also tried to predict when their lives will come to an end. I had an uncle who used to announce every holiday that this was going to be his last Christmas or Easter or Thanksgiving. He knew the end was at hand for him. He was finally right one year, but it was at a much later date than he thought. Other people who believed they had a long life ahead of them found their lives unexpectedly cut short. We don't know the day or the hour when the world will end. We don't know the day or the hour when our lives will come to an end either.

The end of the liturgical year always raises these unpleasant realities for us. One day the world will end. One day our lives will end. Rather than living in fear or giving in to despair, our Lord advises us to do something else. Instead of trying to predict the end or giving in to doom and gloom, our Lord advises us to try to live our lives so we would be prepared for the end whenever it comes.

I'm sure that if we knew the end was at hand, there would be a lot of running around we would do, trying to get our affairs in order and tie up all our loose ends. We would want to make sure we were at peace with God, with our families, with the people around us. Why not try to do that every day? Why not try to be at peace with God and with others every day? Why not keep our affairs in order and take care of our unfinished business in a timelier manner? Why not practice acts of charity and kindness every day? That is what will have us prepared for the end and able to face it with less fear.

I think the type of preparedness our Lord wants us to have is best described by a story I once read. There was an old man who was renowned for his wisdom. One day, a young man went to see him. He asked the wise old man, "If you knew today was going to be your last day on earth, how would you spend it?"

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR CONT.

The old man thought a few minutes, then replied, "I would get up and get dressed. I would take some time to pray and to thank God for the gift of another day. I would have breakfast. Then I might go to see a neighbor who was sick. I would do a little work around the house. I might help one of my neighbors who had some repair work that needed to be done. I might take a nap or read for a while. I would have dinner with some of my friends. Then I would...." At this point, the young man interrupted him. "I asked what would you do if you knew this was going to be your last day," he said. "You're just telling me the things you do every day." "Of course," the old man said. "Why should my last day be different from any other day?" That is the kind of readiness that Jesus is talking about and the kind of readiness for us to strive for. When the way we would live our last day would be no different from the way we live any other day, we are truly prepared for the end, whenever it may come.


ST. VINCENT DEPAUL

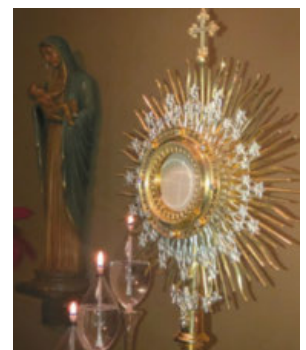

Stroke Scan Plus will be hosting a Stroke, Vascular & Abdominal Ultrasound Screening at Most Holy Redeemer on Thursday, January 16, 2025.

They will check the Carotid Arteries on both sides of the neck for fatty plaque build-up which accounts for 80% of all strokes. They check the Abdominal Aorta which is the main Artery off the Heart for Aneurysms, the Thyroid which controls the Metabolism for cyst, nodules and enlargements, the Liver, Gallbladder and both Kidney's for cyst, masses, fluid build-up and tumors.

These screenings are NOT typically performed at annual physicals, nor will insurance companies pay for them unless you are symptomatic. Collectively, these screenings cost thousands in a hospital. Stroke Scan will be offering them to you for \$169 for all 7 combined. Health/Flex Savings Accounts are accepted. A representative will be visiting the weekend of January 4th/5th to answer questions and for pre-registration. No payment is due until the day of screening. Call (832) 437-7355 for an appointment today. *****Prevention is the KEY to early detection!*****
