Prayers I should already know

- How To Genuflect:
 - Bend on one knee and make the sign of the cross.
- Sign of The Cross:
 - In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.
- Glory Be:
 - Glory be to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit. As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be, world without end. Amen.
- Hail Mary:
 - Hail Mary, full of grace! The Lord is with you; Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of thy womb Jesus. Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners, now and at the hour of our death. Amen.
- Our Father:
 - Our Father, who art in heaven hallowed be thy name; Thy kingdom come; Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.
- Morning Prayer:
 - Say a prayer of thanks to Jesus in your own words.
- Evening Prayer:
 - In your own words, say a prayer of thanks at the end of the day.
- Grace Before Meals:
 - Bless us O Lord, and these your gifts which we are about to receive from your bounty, through Christ our Lord. Amen.
- Act of Contrition:
 - My God, I am sorry for my sins. In choosing to sin, and failing to do good, I have sinned against You and Your Church. I firmly intend, with the help of Your Son, to make up for my sins and to love as I should. Amen.
- Eucharistic Prayer:
 - Lord I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word and my soul shall be healed.

Apostles Creed

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth and in Jesus Christ, his only son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting.
