## **A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR**

The third Sunday of October is observed by the Catholic Church as World Mission Sunday. World Mission Sunday focuses our attention on the missionary nature of the Church and on those who work to spread the gospel in 1,150 missionary territories around the world. We are asked on World Mission Sunday to offer our prayer and financial support to the men and women who work to bring the gospel message to these mission territories.

World Mission Sunday reminds us of our Lord's command to His Apostles to "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature." That is also expressed in the theme for this year's World Mission Sunday, "Go and Invite Everyone to the Banquet." This theme is based on the parable of the wedding feast in the gospel of Matthew in which the king sends out his servants to invite everyone to his son's wedding feast. The gospel is to be proclaimed throughout the world, and World Mission Sunday asks our support for those engaged in this work.

Mission territories are areas where the faith and the Church are in their infancy or still growing to the point where they can stand on their own. When I read that there are 1,150 recognized mission territories around the world, I was surprised. It made me realize how far we have to go to fulfill our Lord's command. It also made me think that a mission territory is not just a country where the Church has not grown to the point where it can stand on its own. Mission territories could also be the worlds of business, politics, education, medicine, entertainment, and others where Christian values and ethics seem to have little influence. There are also countries where the Church was once strong and vibrant that have now become countries where the Church is in decline and where re-evangelization is needed.

One thing we should keep in mind is that the missionary work of the Church is not just something for the men and women who work to spread the gospel in those 1,150 missionary territories. Our Lord's command to "proclaim the gospel to every creature" is a command for all of us. On this World Mission Sunday, we should think about how we can bring the gospel to the mission territories we find ourselves in. What can we do, for example, to bring the message of the gospel to the business world? Treat employees better? End unjust working conditions? End dishonest business practices? Can we bring the gospel message to the world of entertainment? Read the lyrics to a lot of popular songs. Pay attention to the ideas being promoted in movies and television. A great deal of what we see and hear is not in line with the values of the gospel. Is there anything we can do to change that? The Second Vatican Council said that the role of the laity in the Church is the transformation of the world. We are to transform the world more and more into the Kingdom of God here on earth. We help to do that when we are the missionaries who bring the gospel message and values to these missionary territories in our lives and seek to transform them.

We certainly want to support the work of those who labor to bring the gospel message to those 1,150 mission territories around the world. Let's also keep in mind our own call to be missionaries. There are a lot of "unofficial" mission territories that we will find ourselves in. What can we do to proclaim the gospel in these unofficial mission territories, and invite everyone to the banquet?

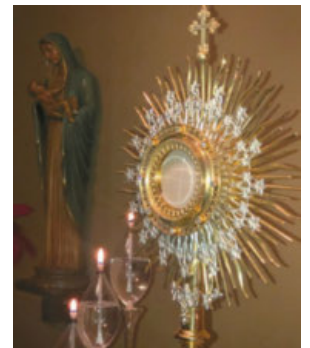

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,


Today we join with every diocese around the globe to celebrate World Mission Sunday. This day of prayer and action supports the vitality and growth of the Church everywhere, but especially the most remote and struggling dioceses. Our celebration of the Eucharist, works of solidarity, and personal sacrifice all contribute to the good of the Church beyond our local boundaries.

This year, Pope Francis has selected the theme "Go and invite everyone to the banquet" (cf. Matthew 22:1-14).
